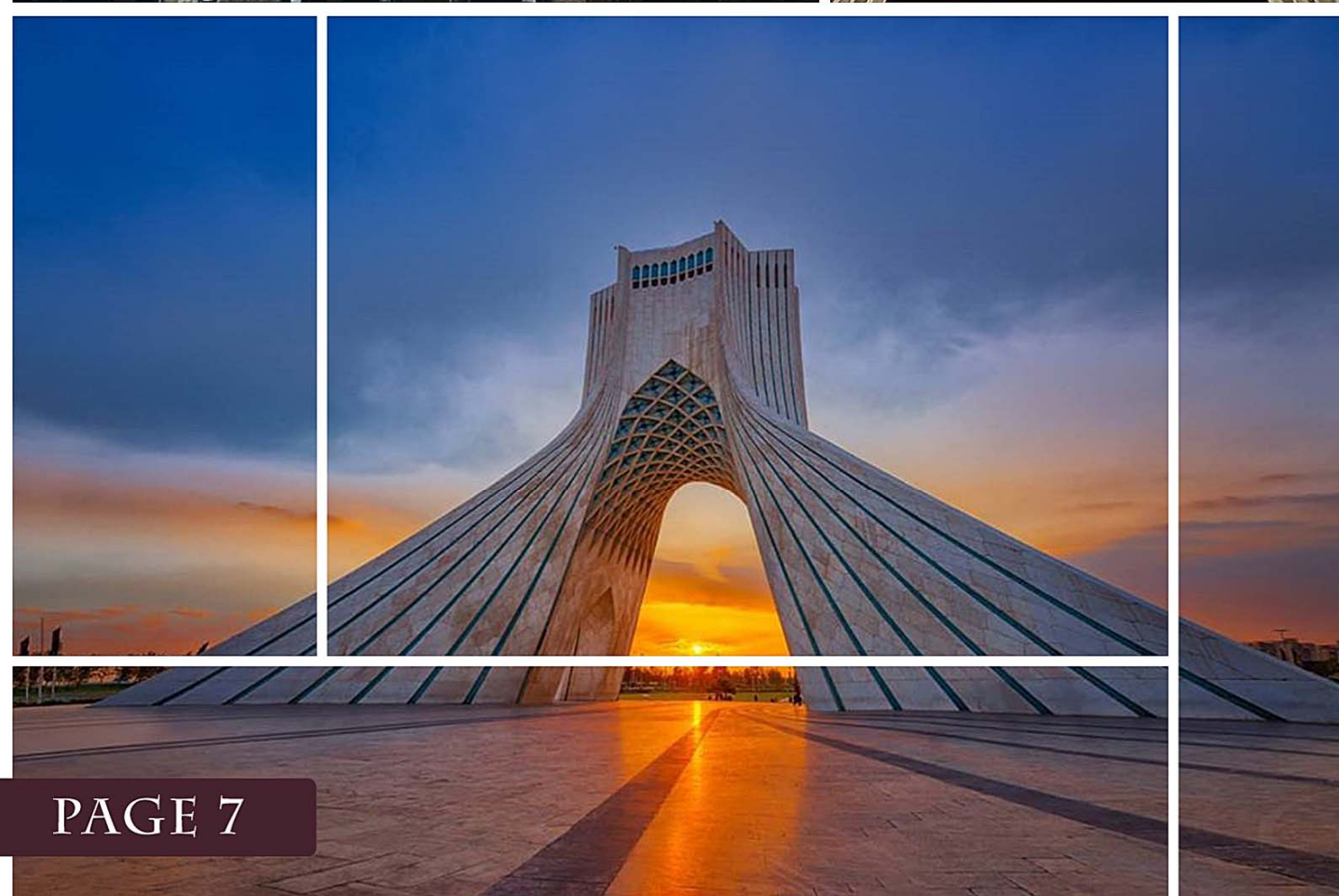
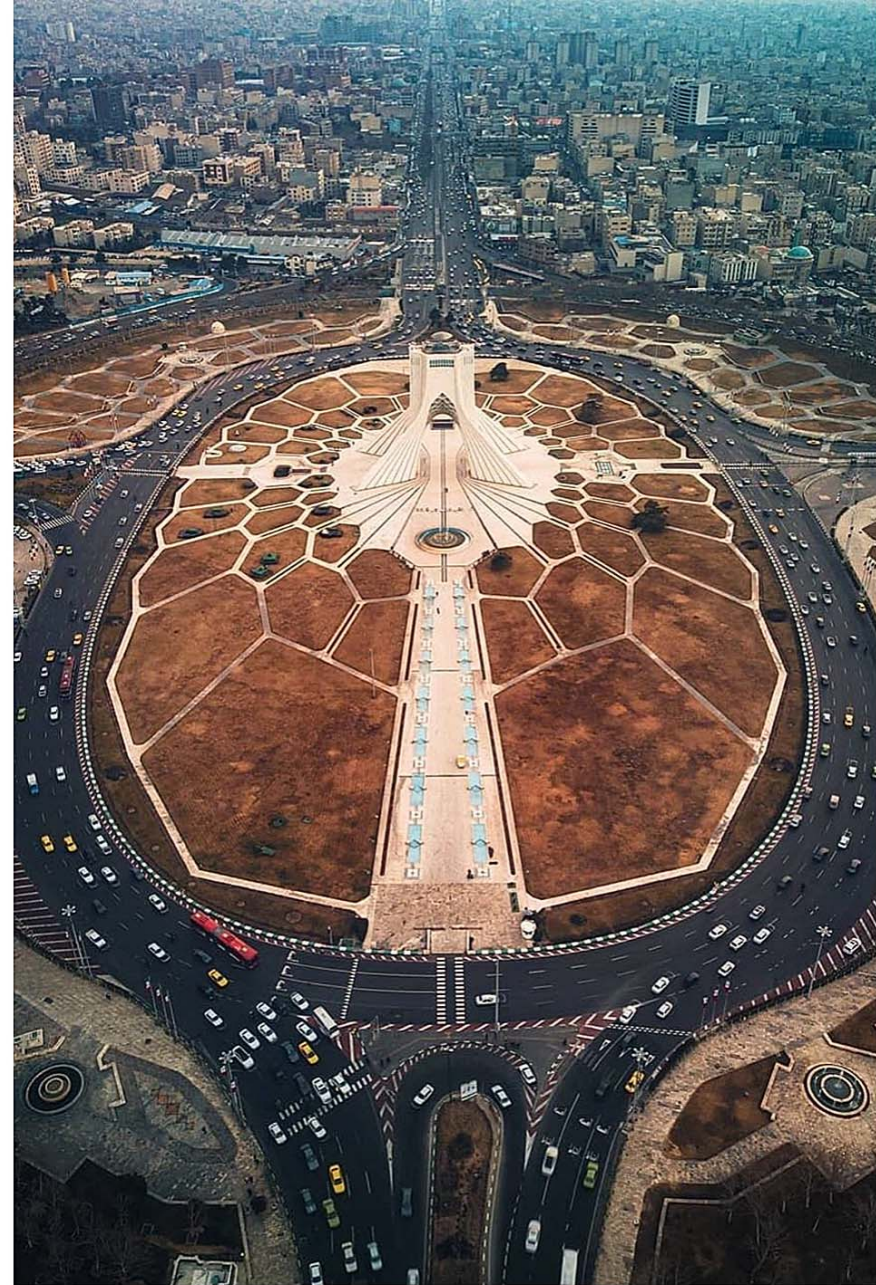
AZADI TOWER

Azadi Tower is a landmark of Tehran with 45 meters height, designed by Hossein Amanat.

Address: Azadi Square



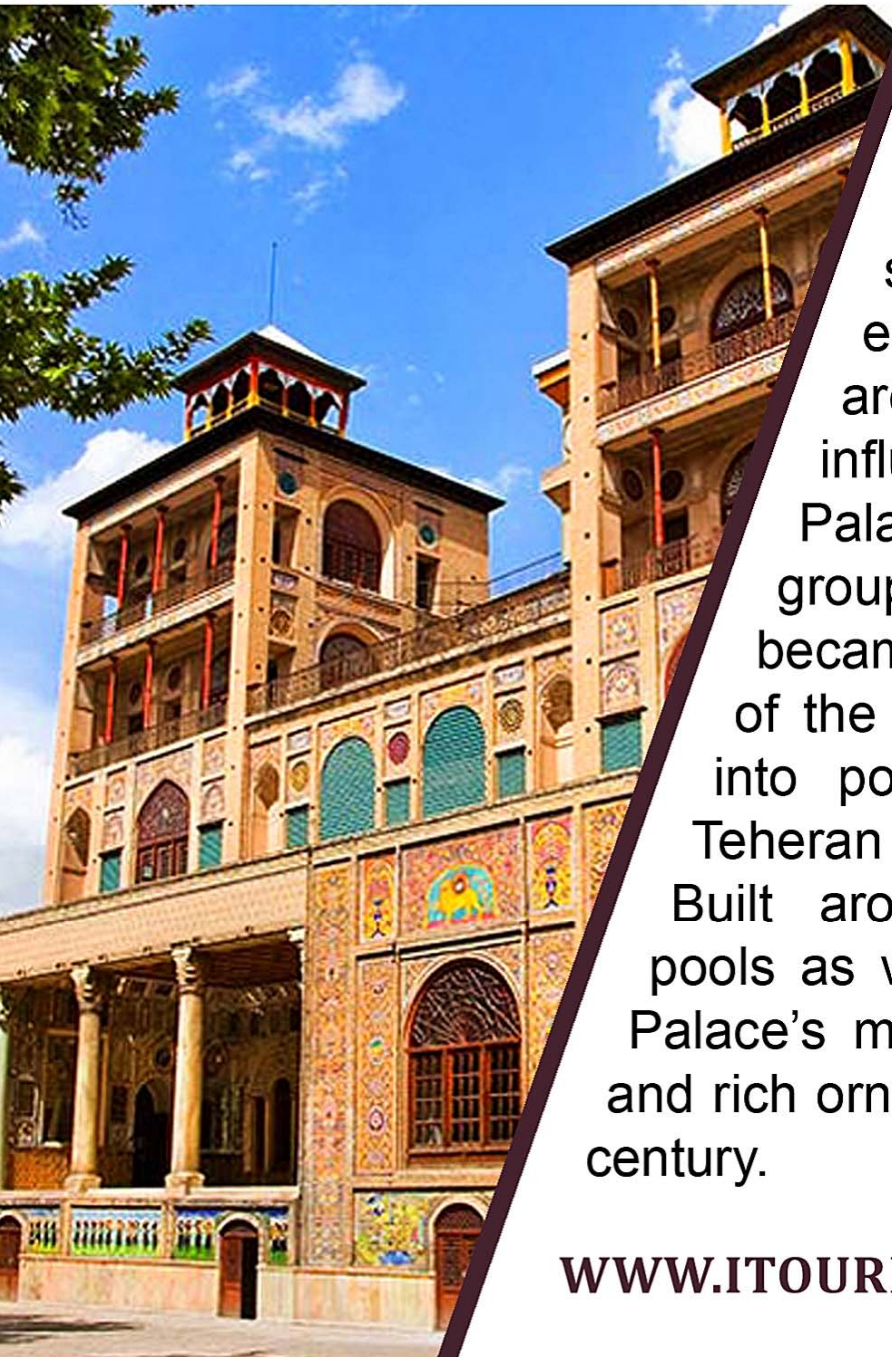
The Azadi Tower, formerly known as the Shahyad Tower, is a monument located on Azadi Square in Tehran, Iran. It is one of the landmarks of Tehran, marking the west entrance to the city, and is part of the Azadi Cultural Complex, which also includes a museum underground. The tower is about 45 metres (148 ft) tall and is completely clad in cut marble. It was commissioned by Mohammad Reza Pahlavi, the last Shah of Iran, to mark the 2,500th year of the foundation of the Imperial State of Iran.



GOLESTAN PALACE

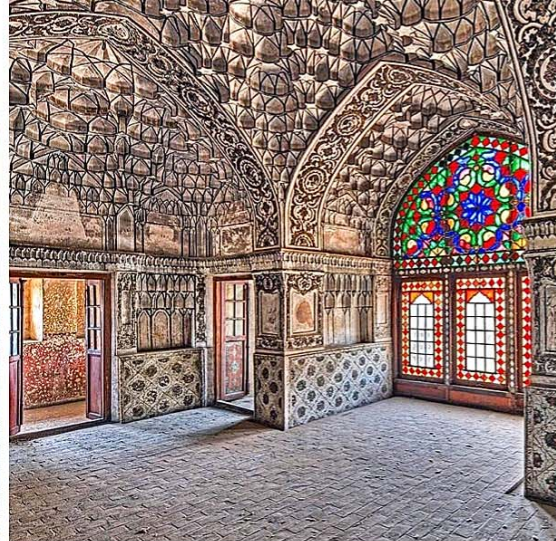
Golastan Palace is one of the oldest historic monuments in the city of Tehran.

The Golestan Palace is a masterpiece of the Qajar era, embodying the successful integration of earlier Persian crafts and architecture with Western influences. The walled Palace, one of the oldest groups of buildings in Teheran, became the seat of government of the Qajar family, which came into power in 1779 and made Teheran the capital of the country. Built around a garden featuring pools as well as planted areas, the Palace's most characteristic features and rich ornaments date from the 19th century.

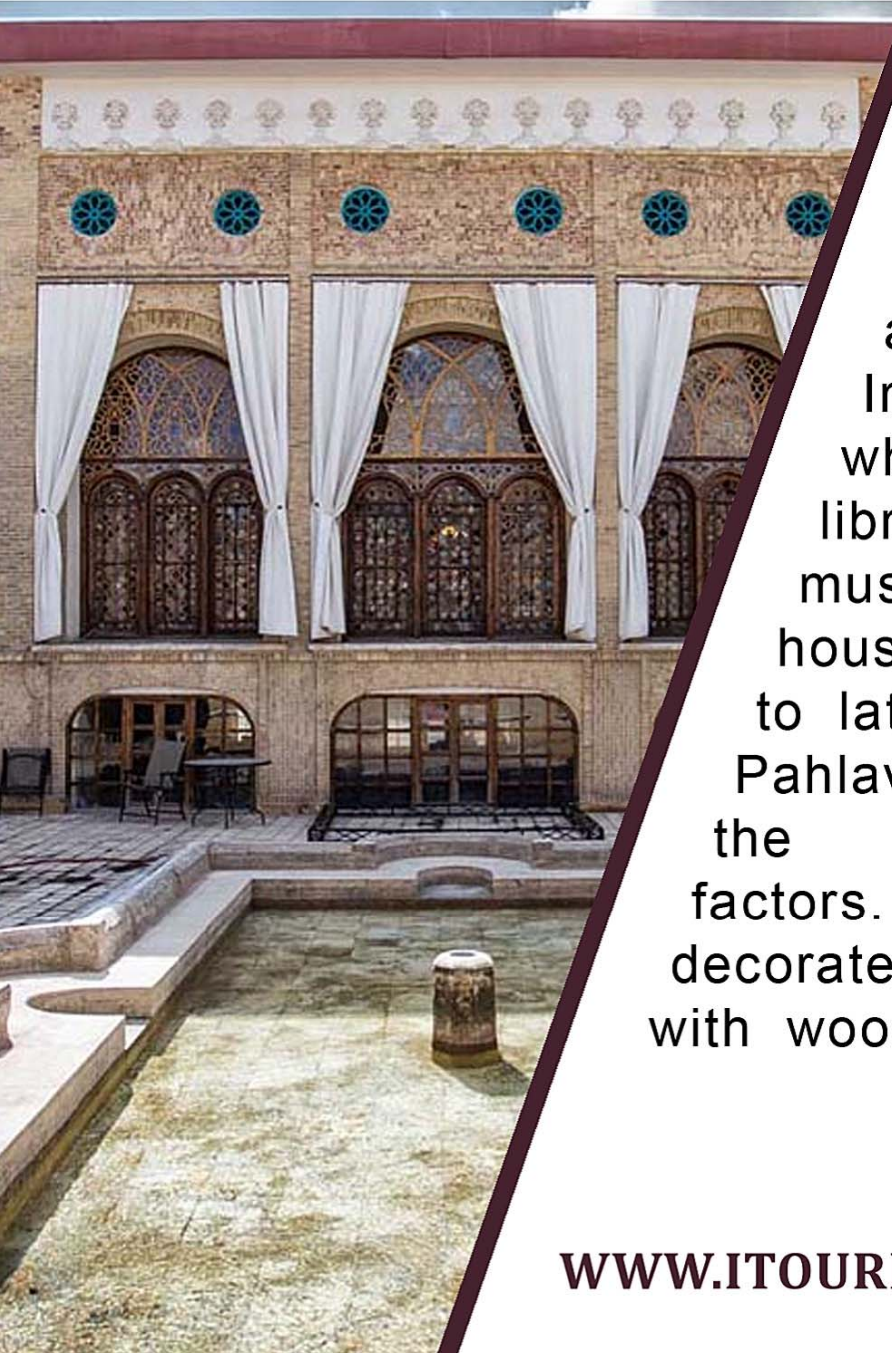

Address: Imamzadeh Yahya St



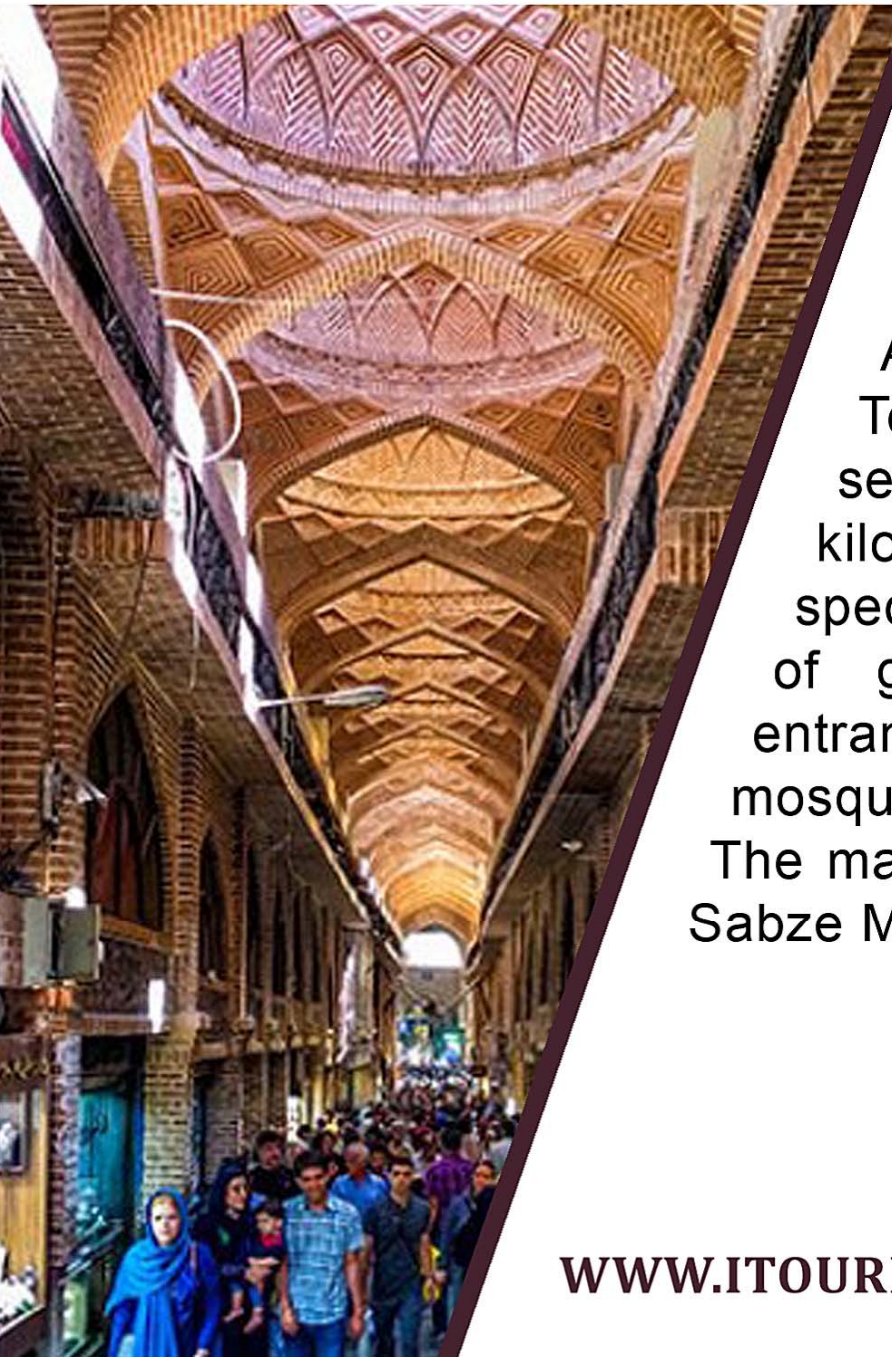

The building was decorated with sash windows with wooden frames and doors.



THE GRAND BAZAAR

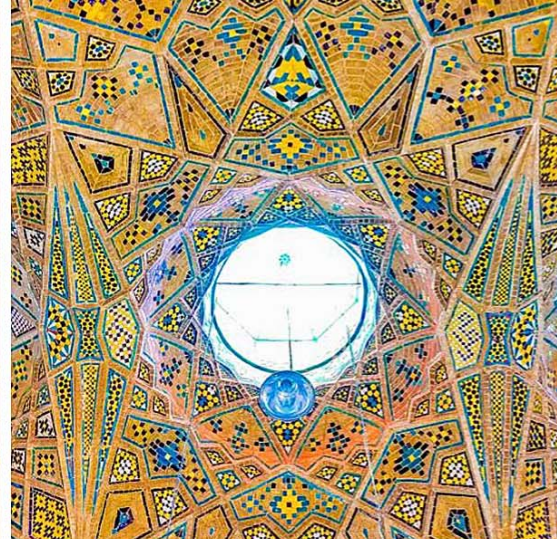
The Grand Bazaar is the busiest mall in Iran and the second biggest after Tabriz mall.

The Grand Bazaar is an old historical market which is located in at the Arg Square in Southern Tehran. It splits into several corridors over 10 kilometers in length, each specializing in different types of goods. It has several entrances containing banks, mosques and guest houses. The main entrance is in front of Sabze Meydan.

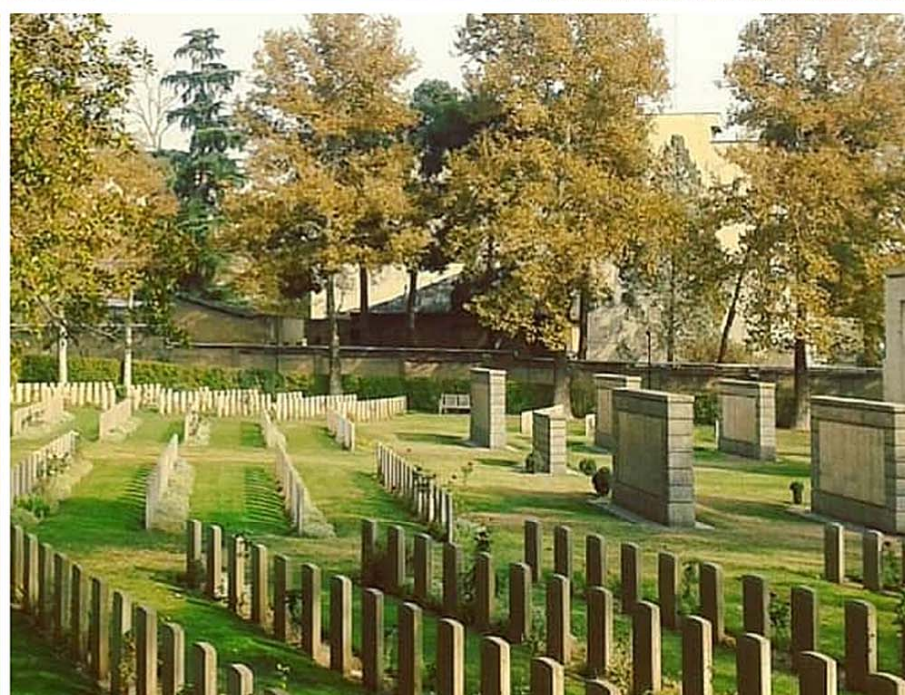
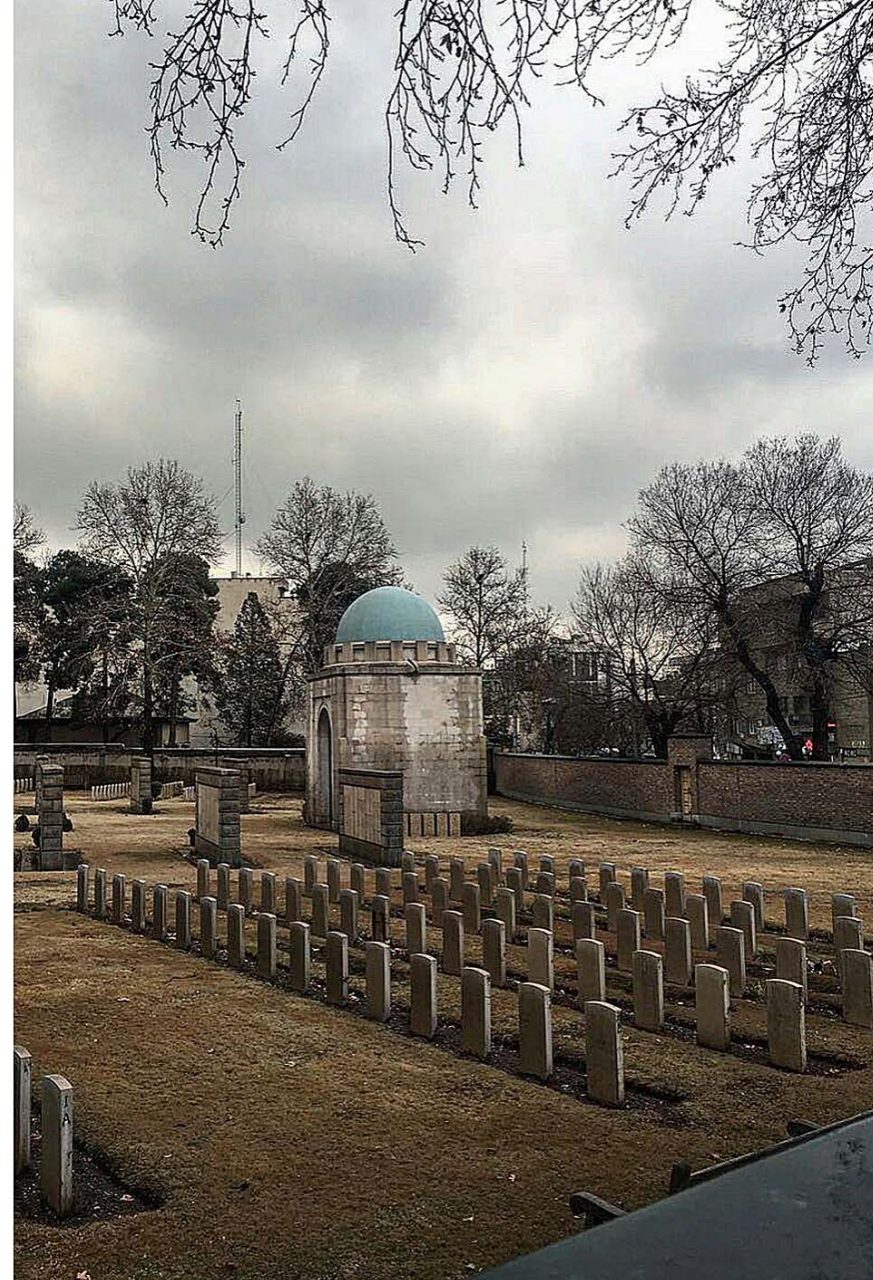
Tehran war cemetery is the memorial of the world war casualties.

Tehran War Cemetery is located on the southern edge of the British Embassy's Gholhak compound in north Tehran. Within the cemetery is the Tehran Memorial commemorating casualties from both World Wars. The Memorial is in the form of six free standing memorial walls and commemorates casualties of the Indian, United Kingdom and New Zealand Forces who lost their lives during the campaign in Iran.

MILAD TOWER

The tower is a part of the International Trade and Convention Center of Tehran, which also includes a five-star hotel, a convention center, a world trade center and an IT park.

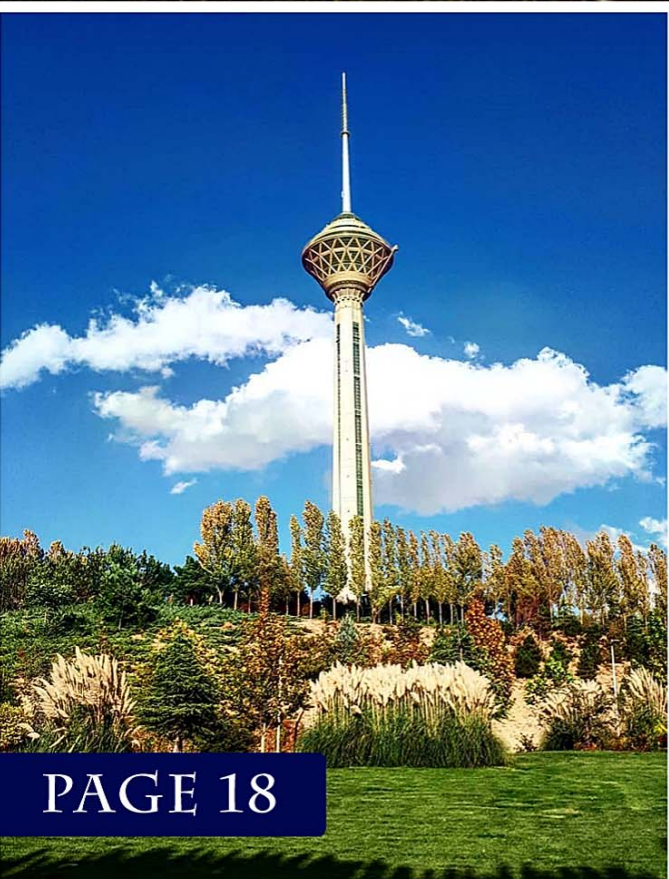

Milad Tower, also known as Teheran Tower, is a 435 m-high multi-purpose Iranian concrete tower built in 2007 in between the Shahrak-e Gharb and Gisha districts of Tehran. As mentioned, it stands at 435 m from base to the tip of the antenna. The head consists of a large pod with 12 floors, the roof of which is at 315 m. In terms of height records and ranks, Milad Tower is the sixth tallest tower in the world after the Canton Tower in Guangzhou, CN Tower in Toronto, Ostankino Tower in Moscow, the Oriental Pearl Tower in Shanghai, and the Tokyo Skytree. It is also the current 17th tallest freestanding structure in the world.

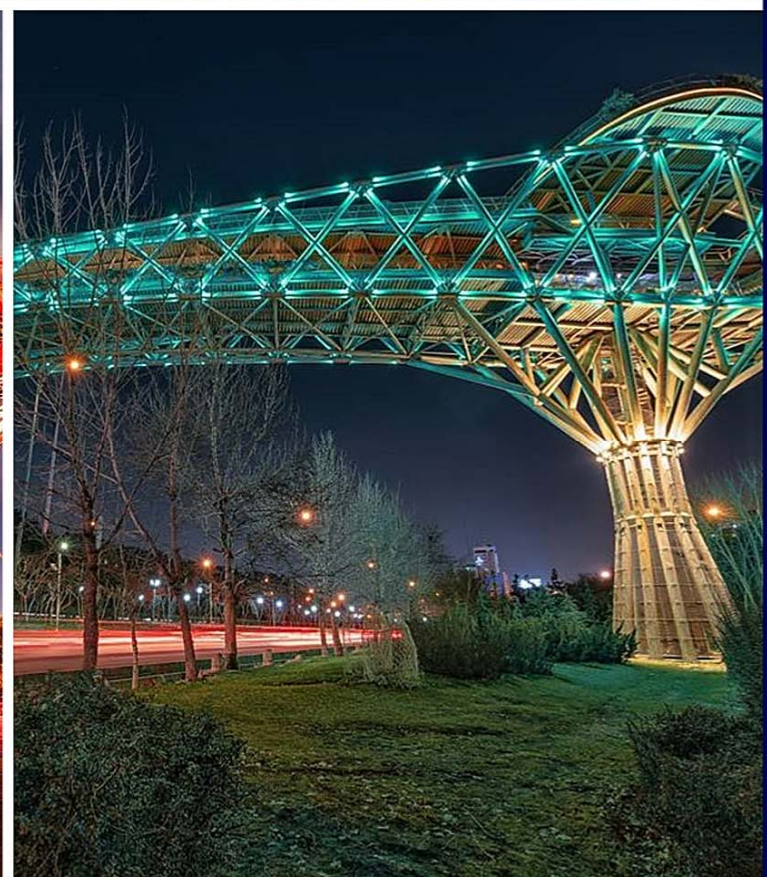
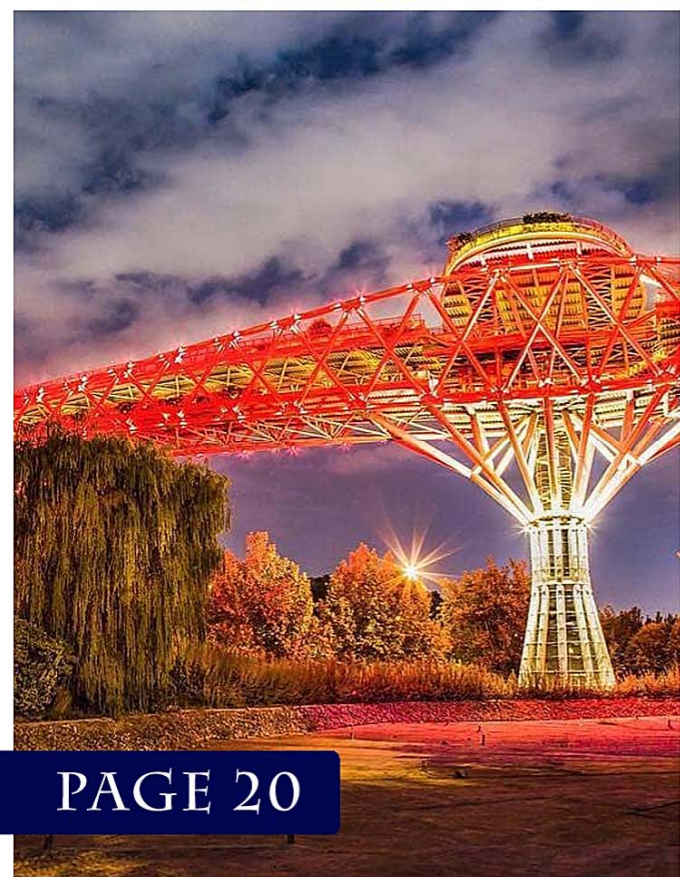
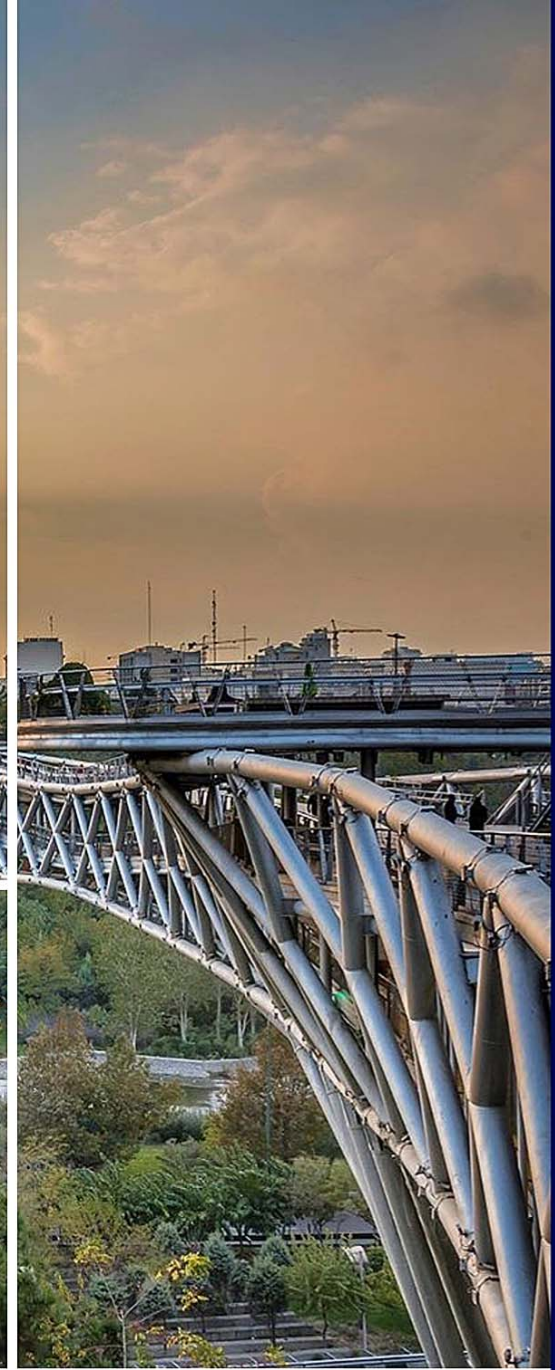
The Tabiat Bridge is the first non-road bridge in the country which connects two major parks in Tehran, Taleghani Park and Ab-o-Atash Park.

The Tabiat Bridge is the first non-road bridge in the country and the biggest non-road bridge in the Middle East which connects two major parks in Tehran, Taleghani Park and Ab-o-Atash Park. This structure with an area of 7950 square meters is located 40 meters above ground level and on the highway of Modares.

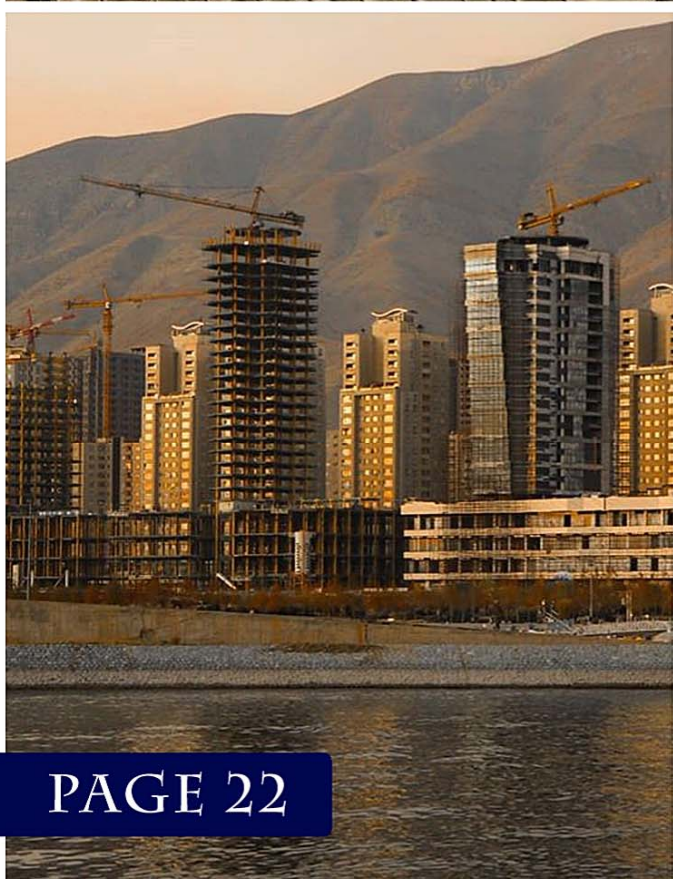
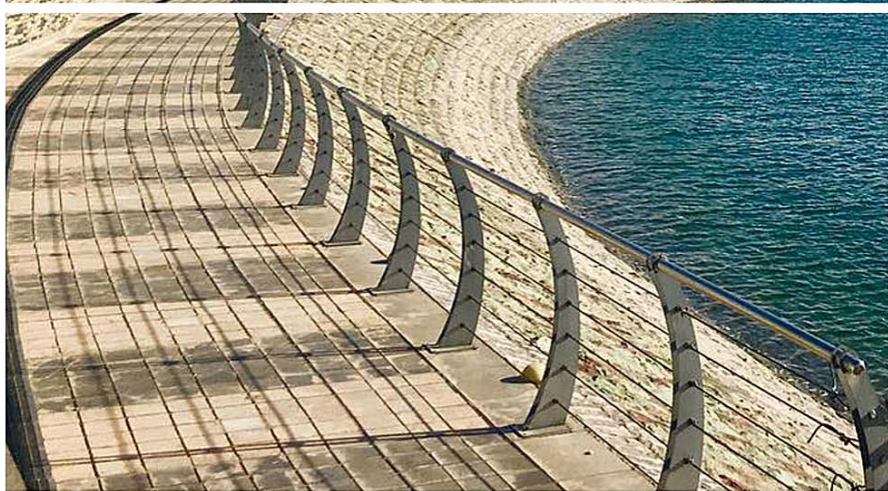
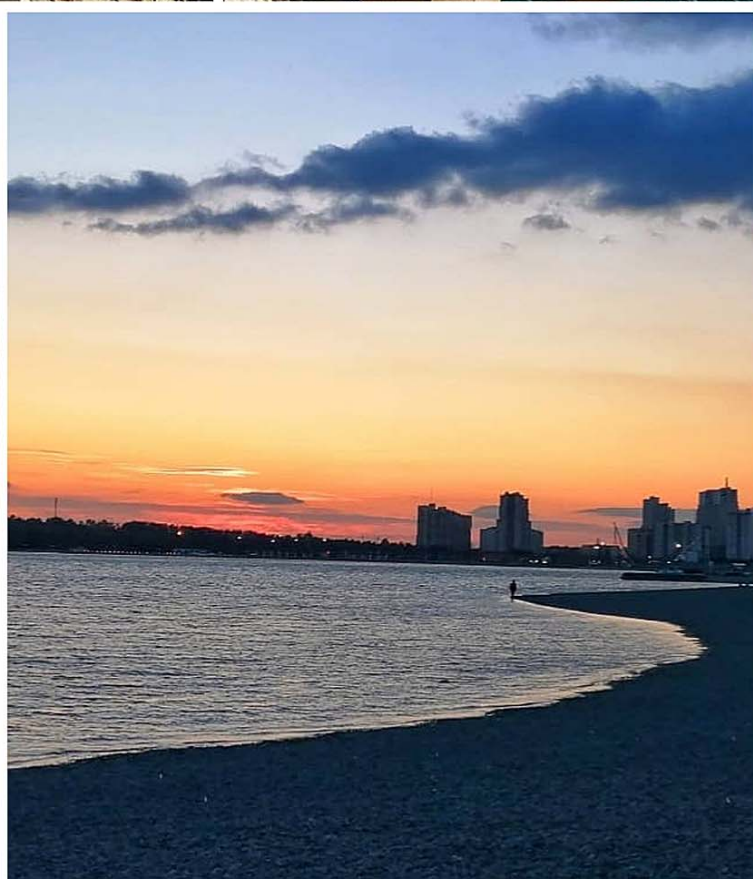
Chitgar Park is a large jungle park in Tehran with a variety of entertainment facilities.

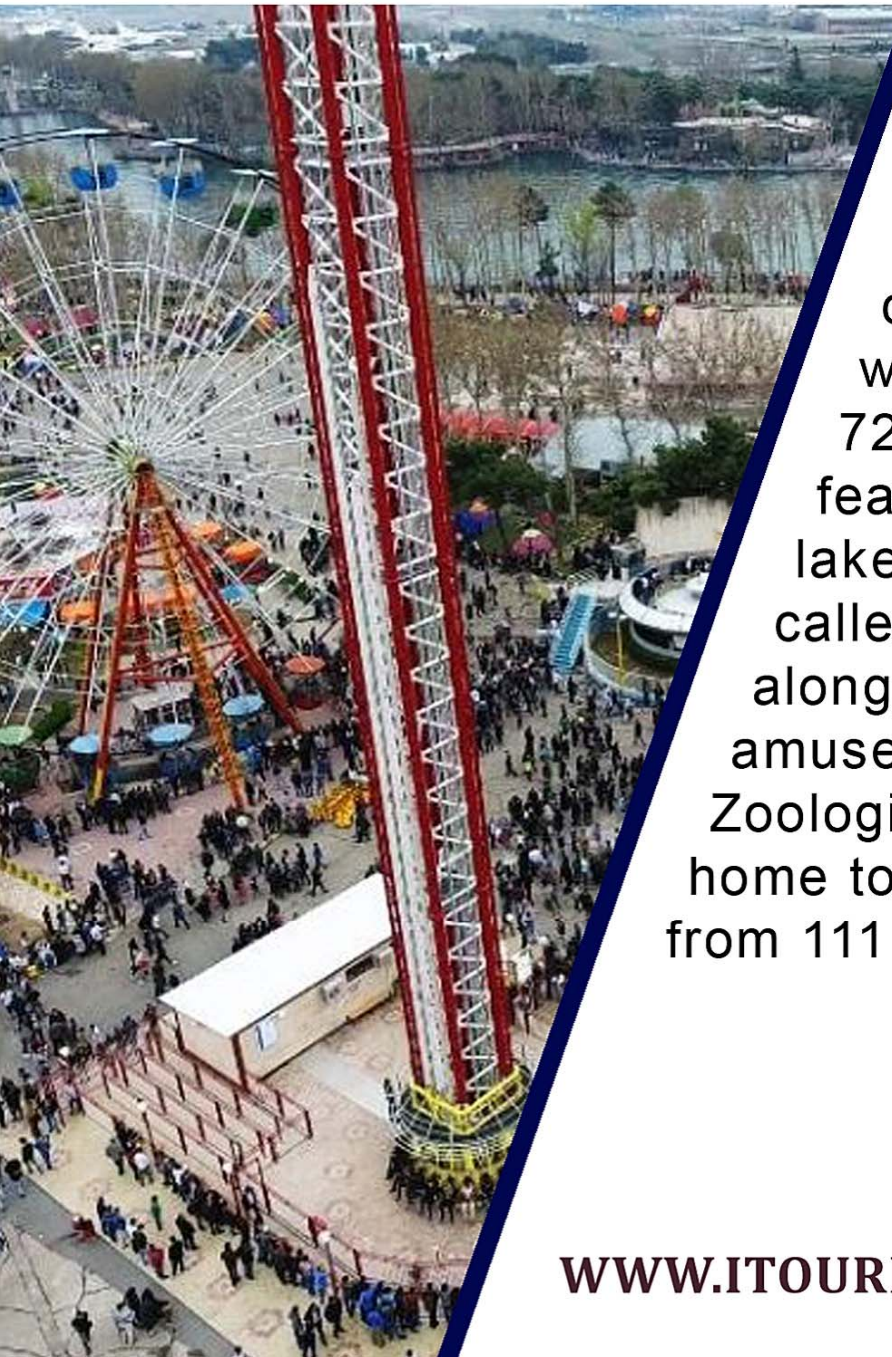




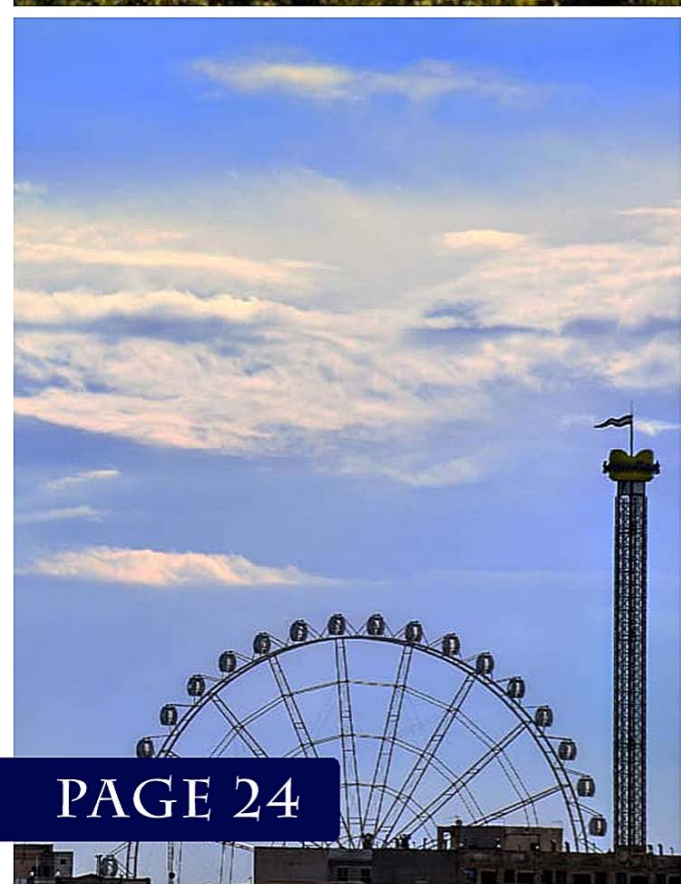
ERAM PARK

Address: Tehran-Karaj Hwy



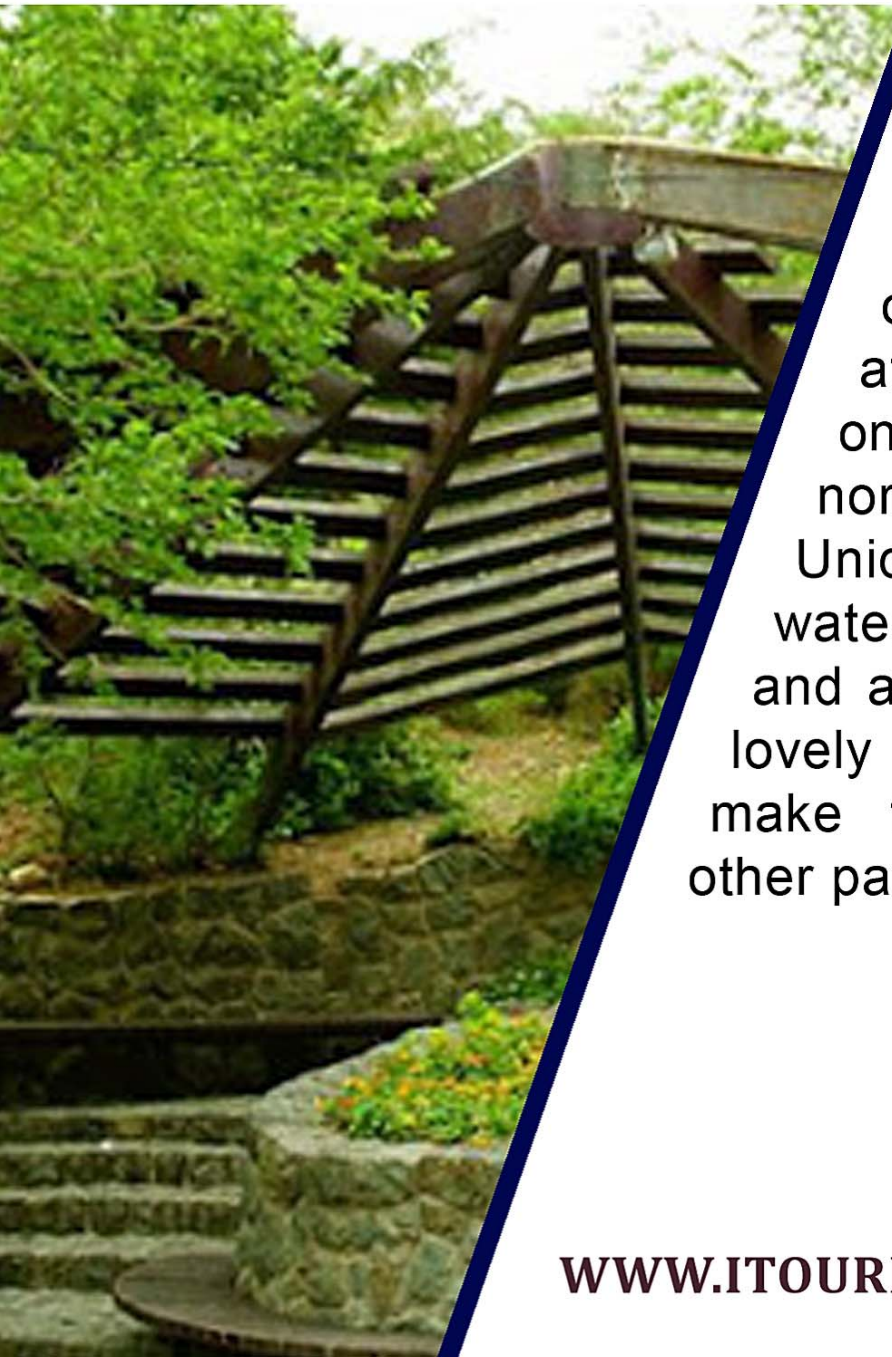

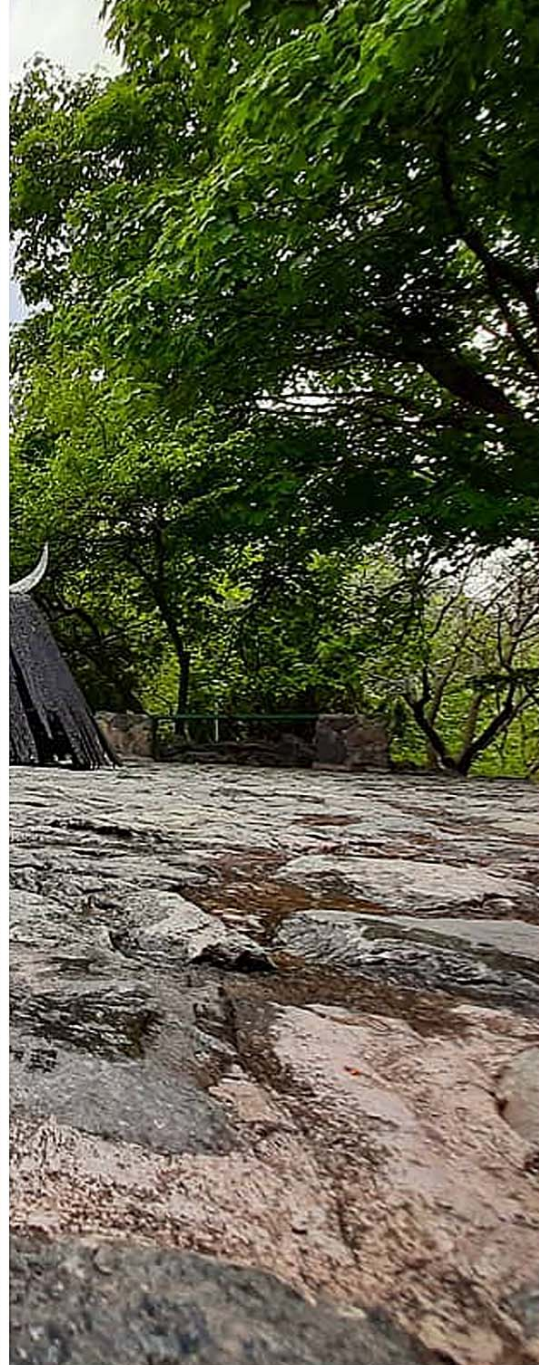
JAMSHIDIEH PARK

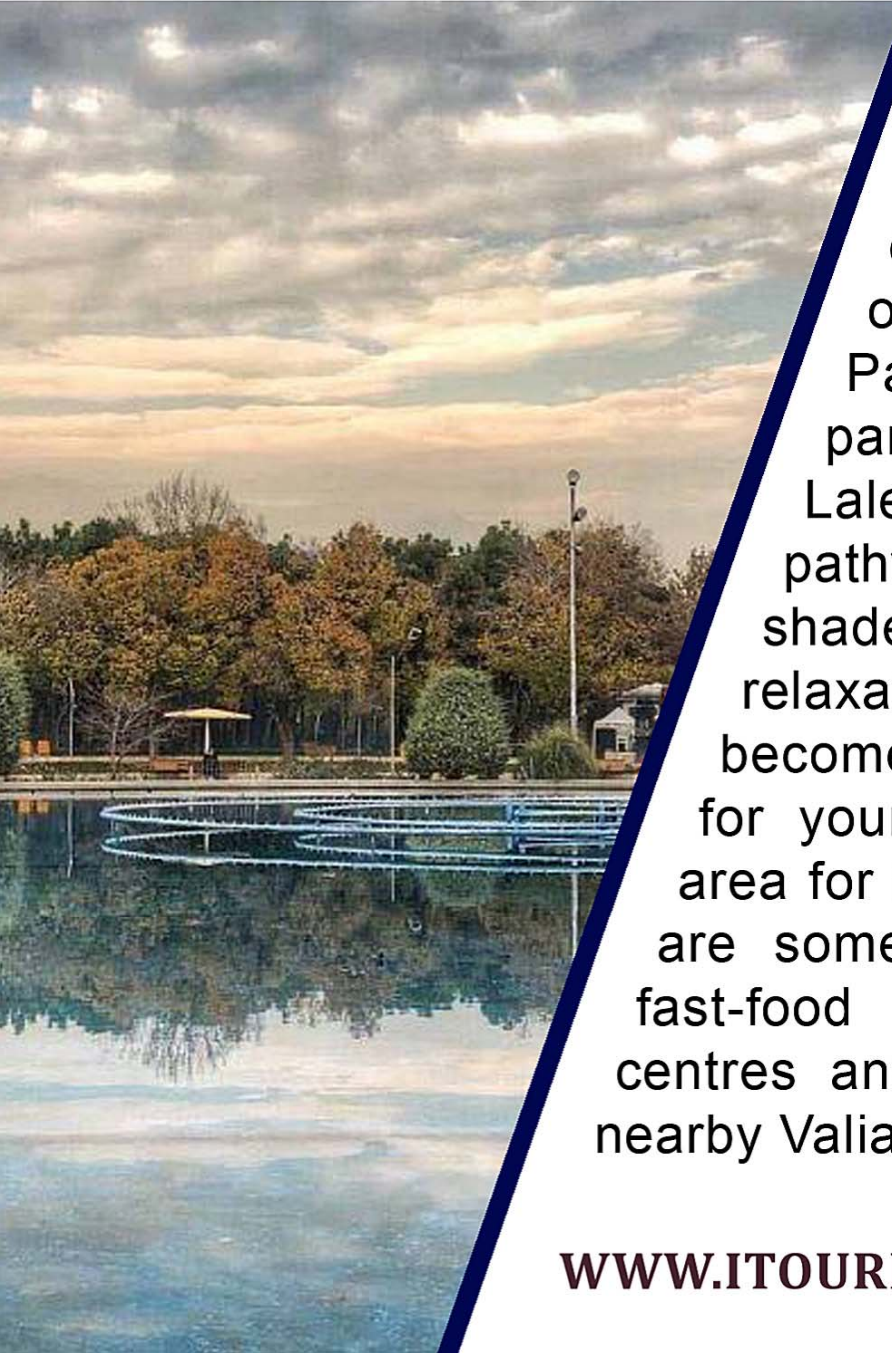
Laleh is one of the largest and most beautiful parks in Tehran.

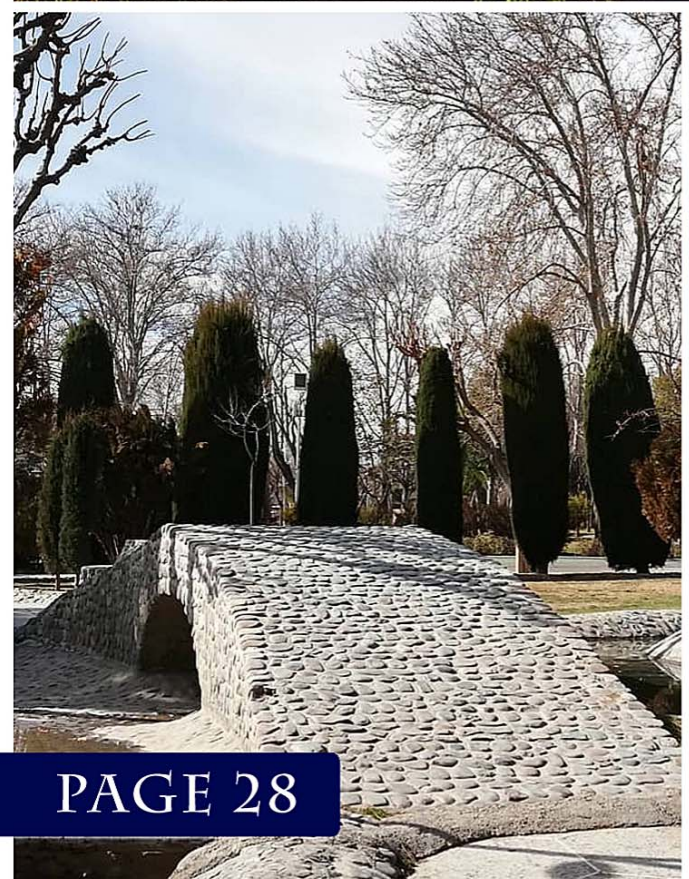
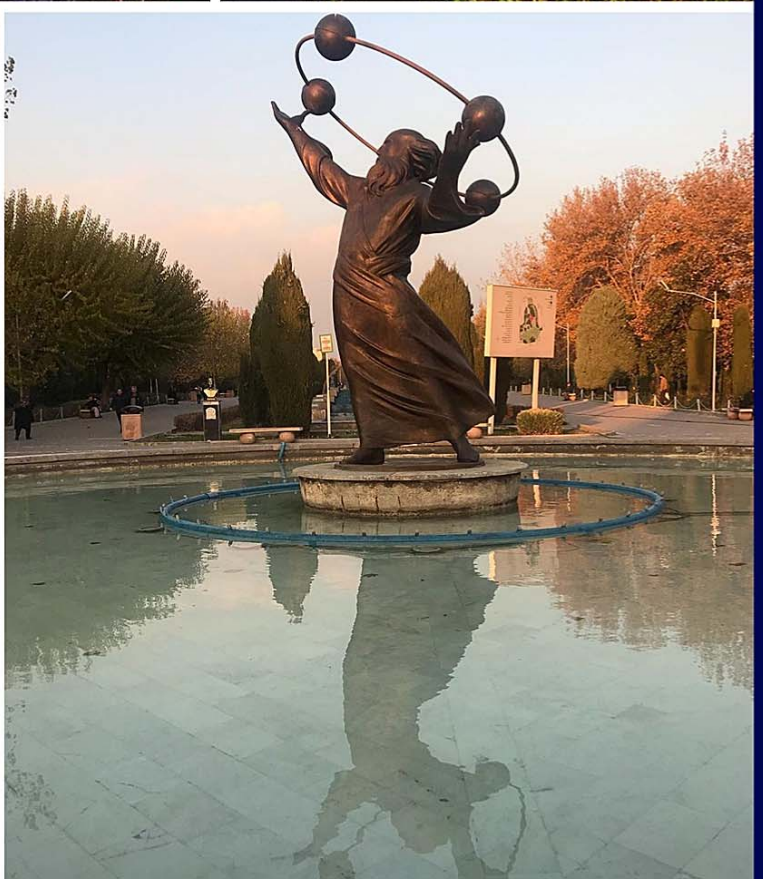
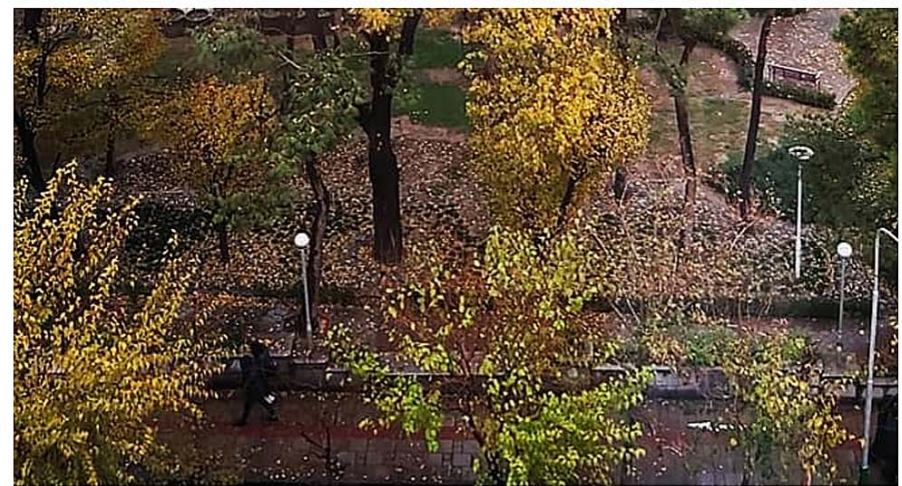
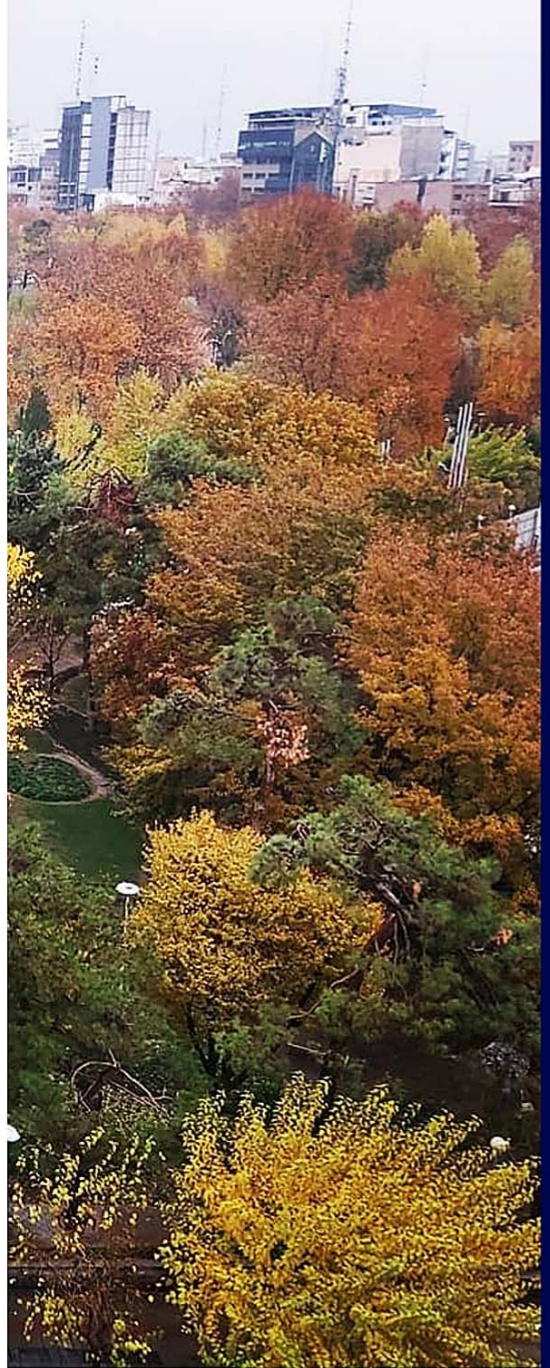

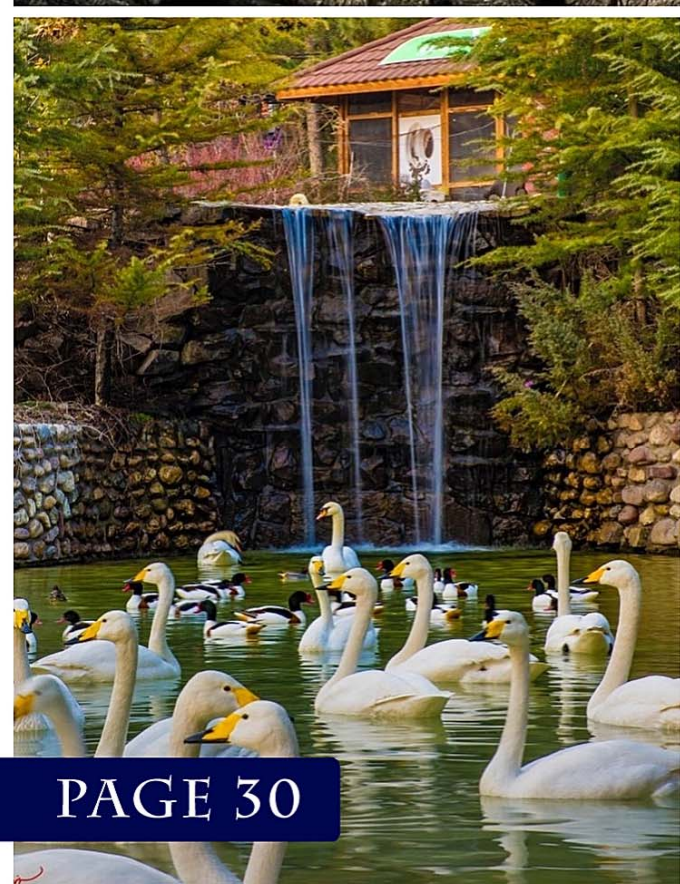
LAVIZAN FOREST PARK

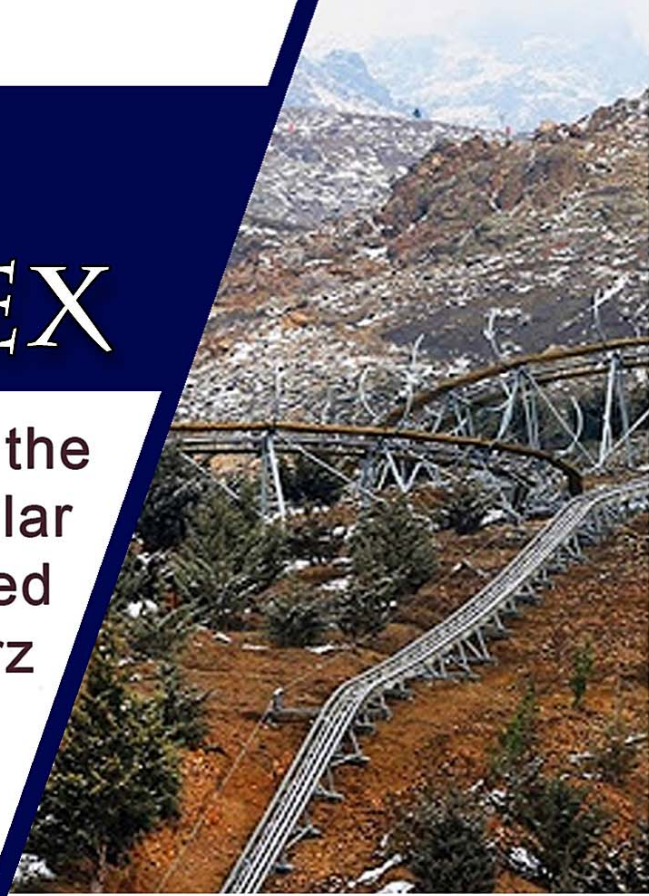

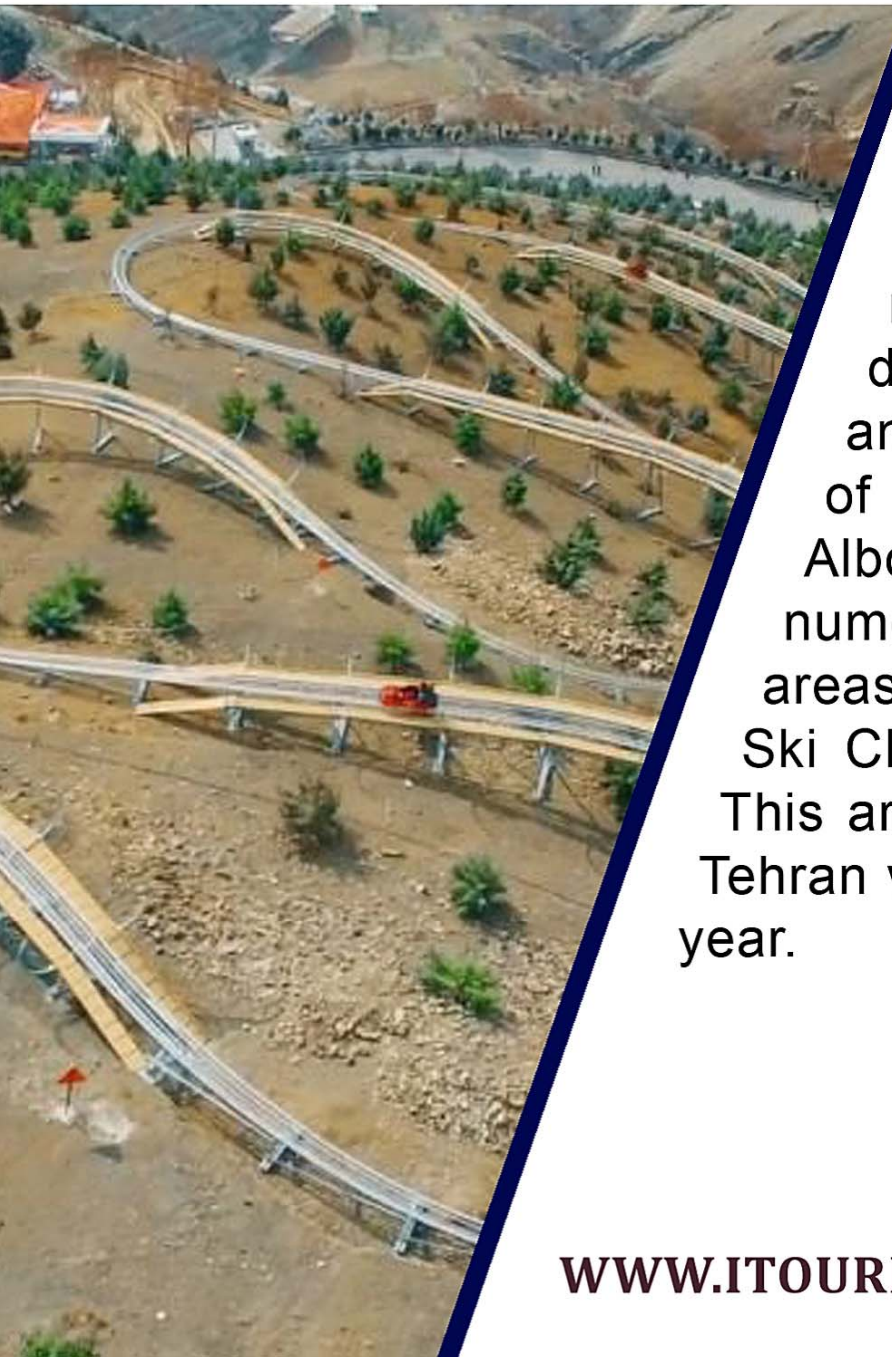

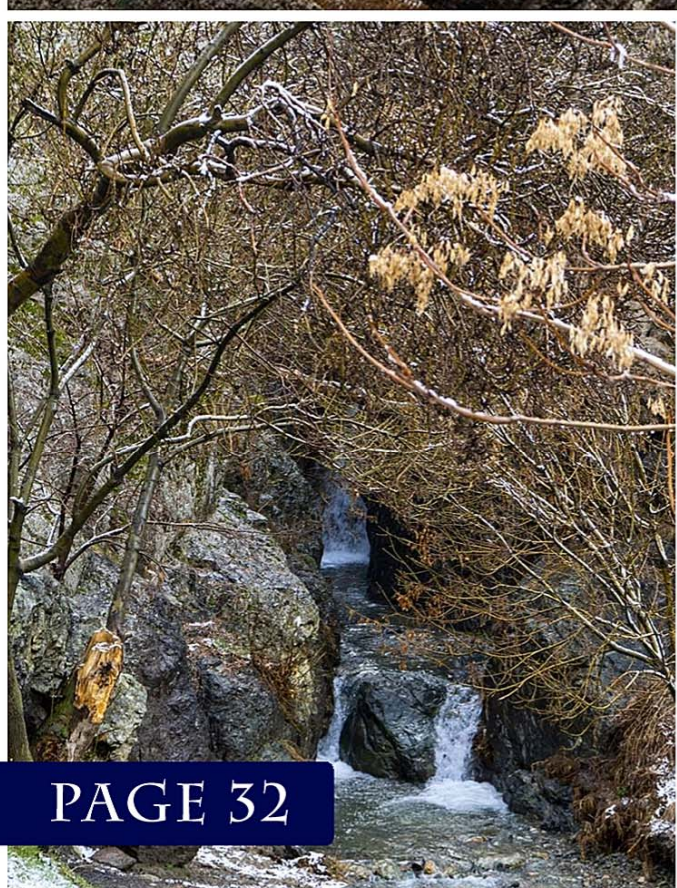
Tochal Tourist Resort is one of the oldest and most popular destinations in the capital located in the north of Tehran in Alborz Range.

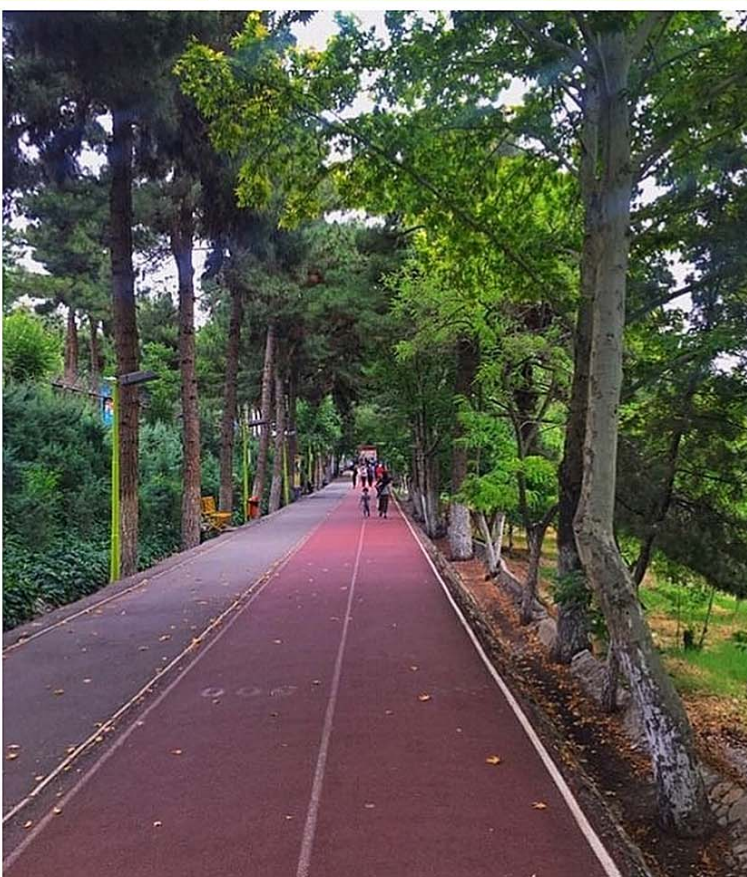
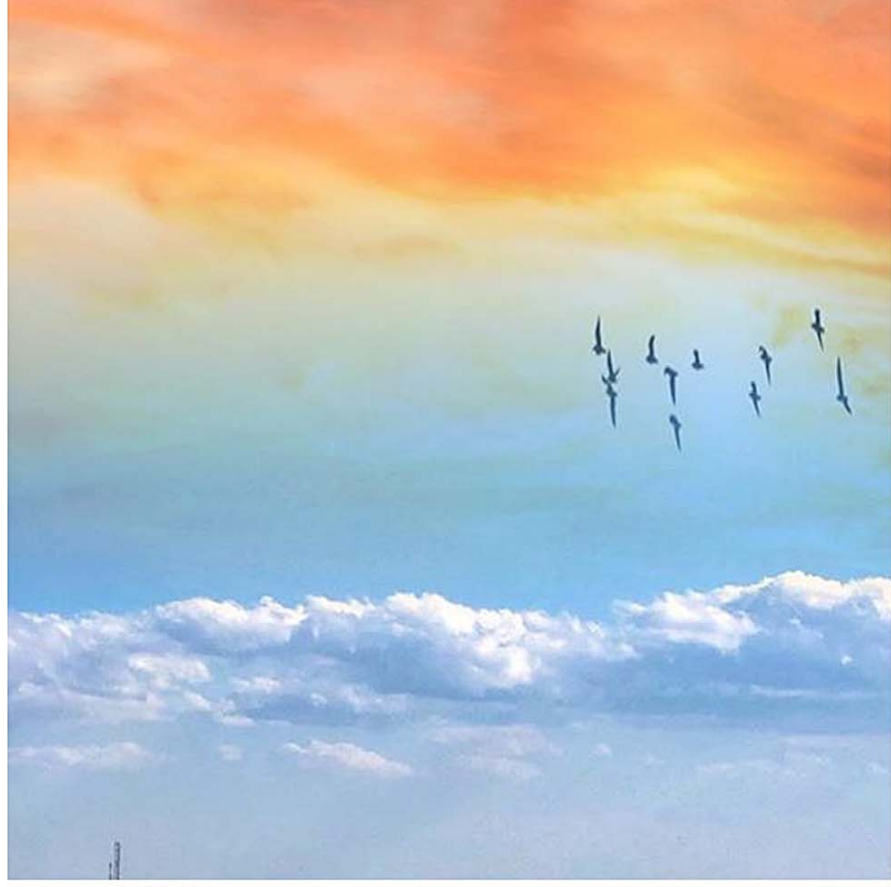
Enghelab Sport Complex is a complete recreational and sport site with multiple fields which hosts about 10000 people daily who participate in different activities.

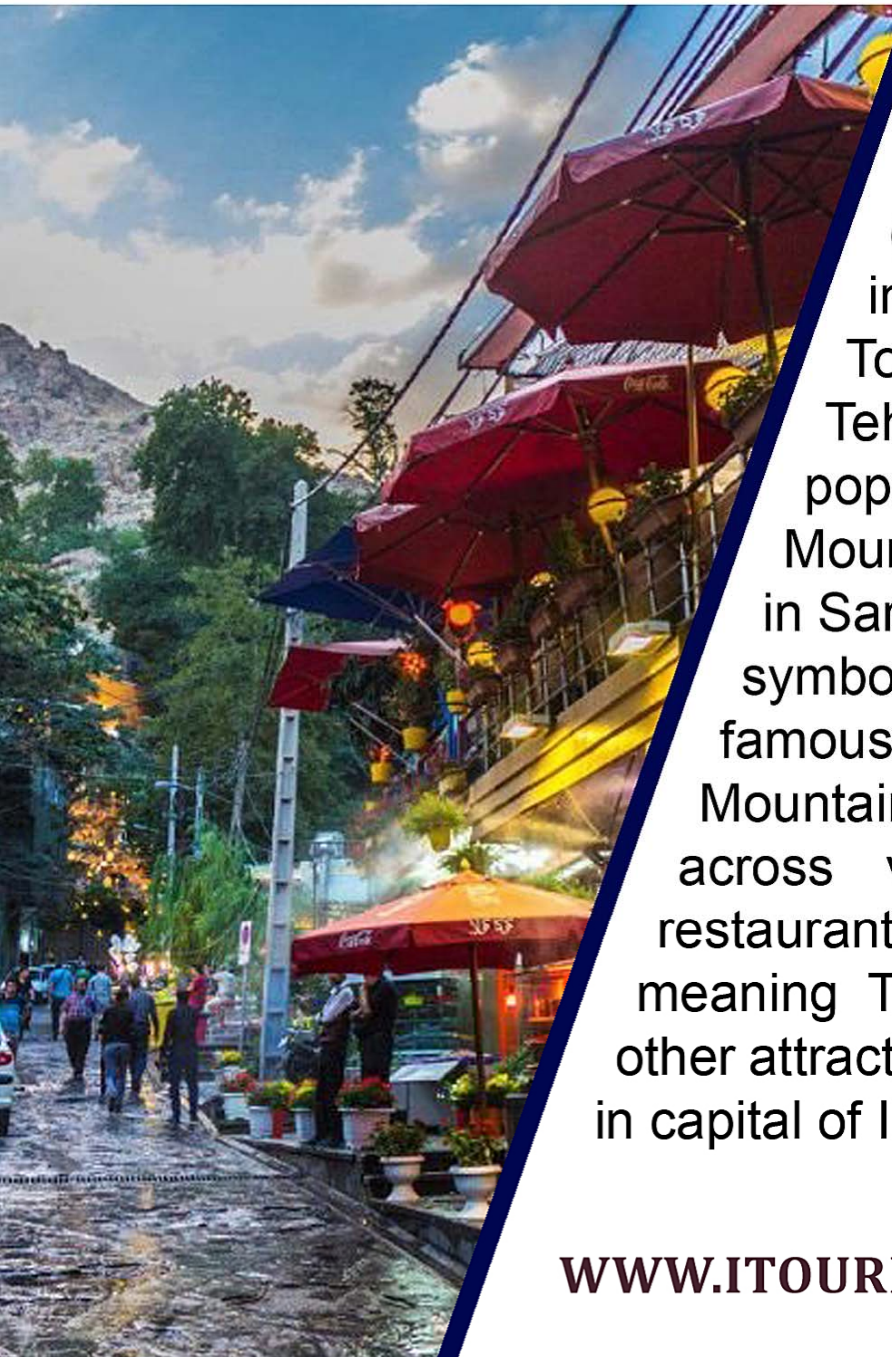
DARBAND

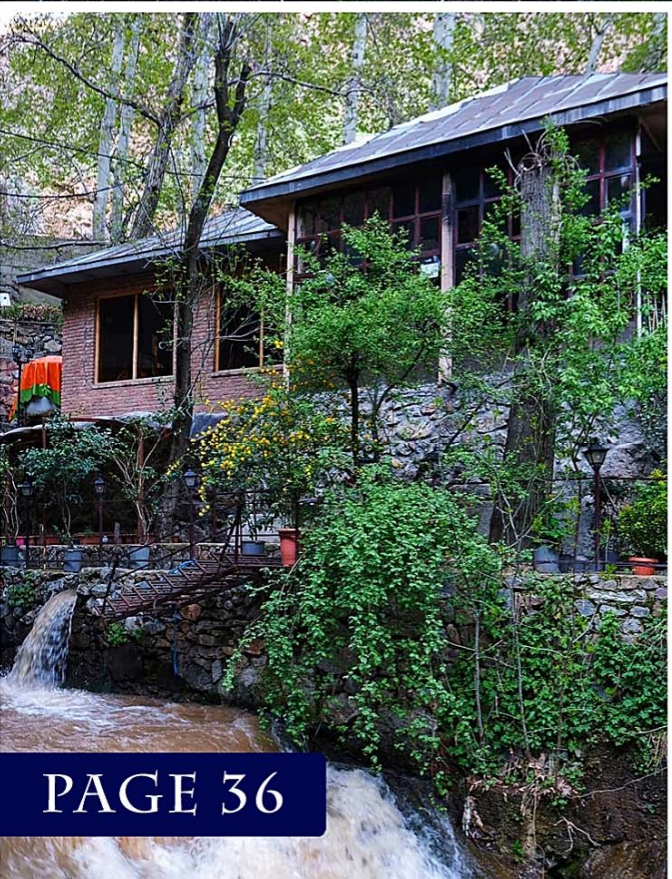
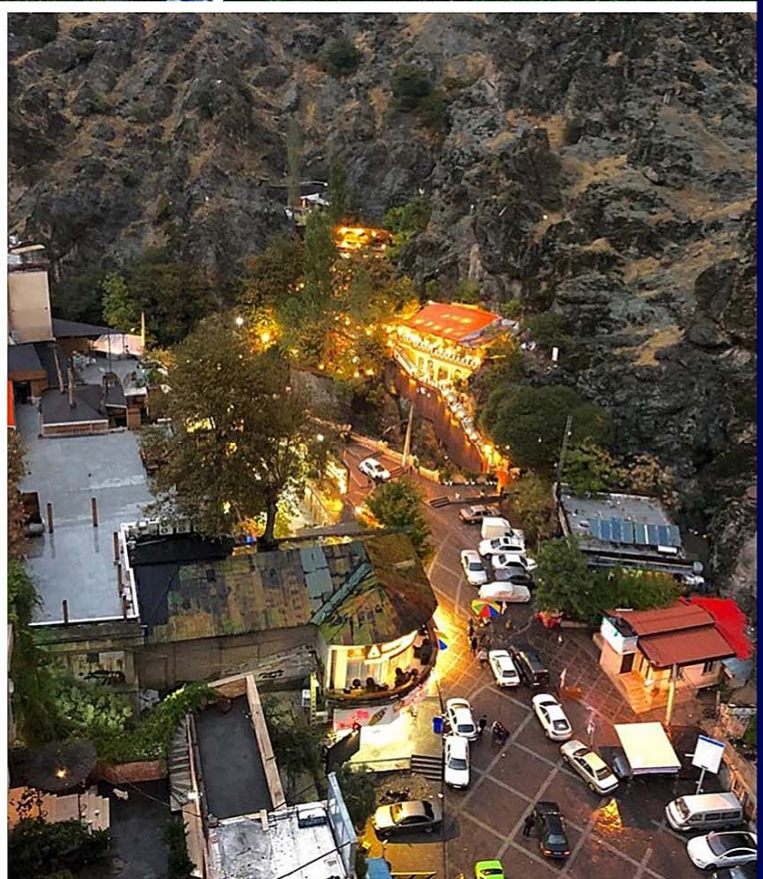
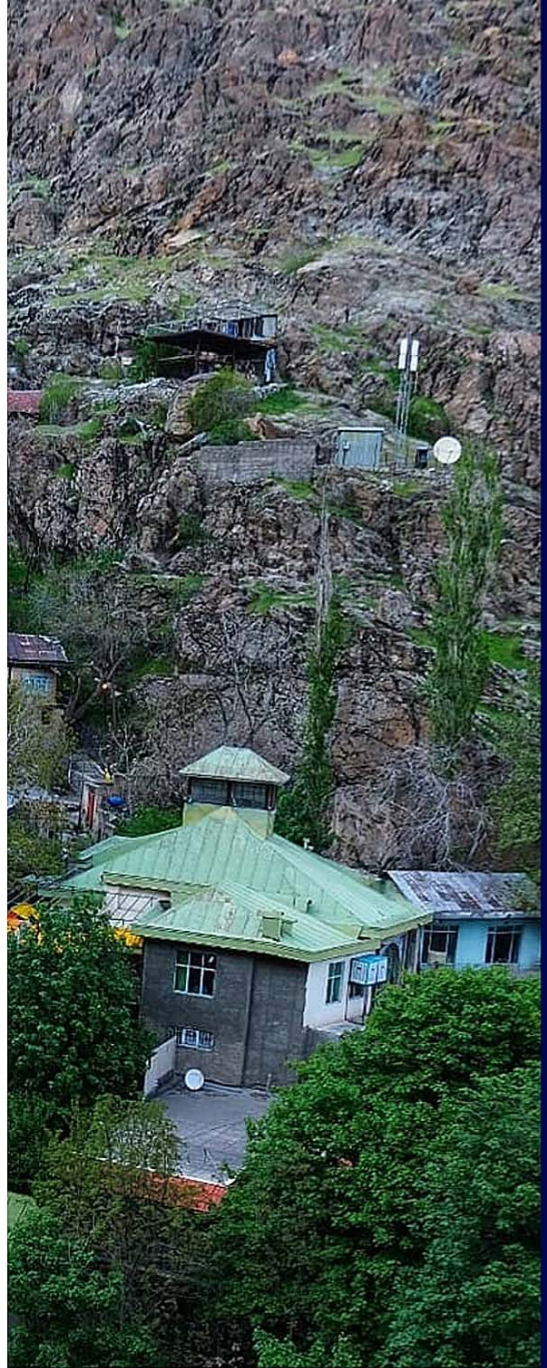
Darband, with Mountainous area, beautiful river across valley, small and large restaurant, Dogholoo Fall and so on, is one of the most popular region in Tehran.

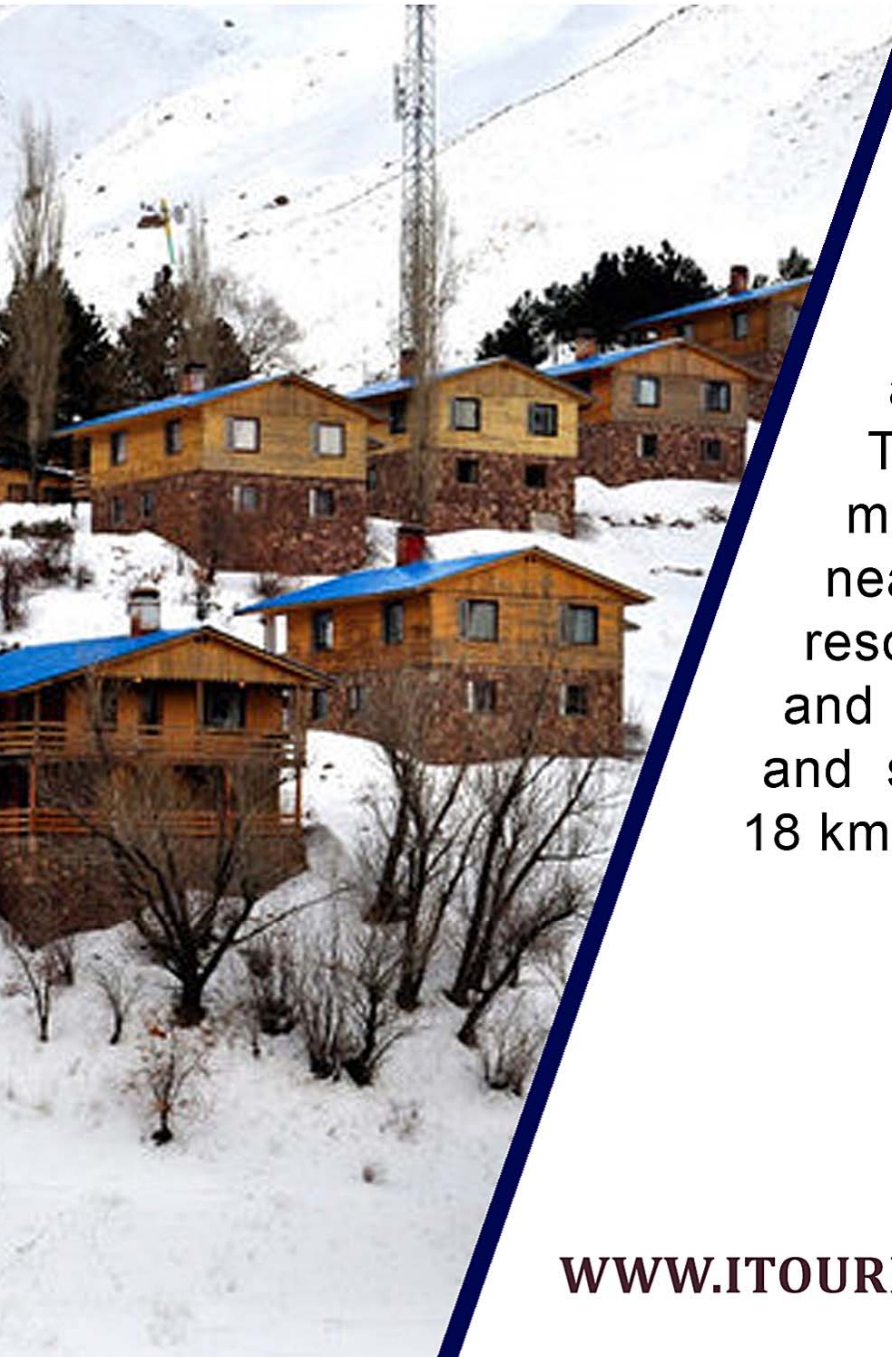




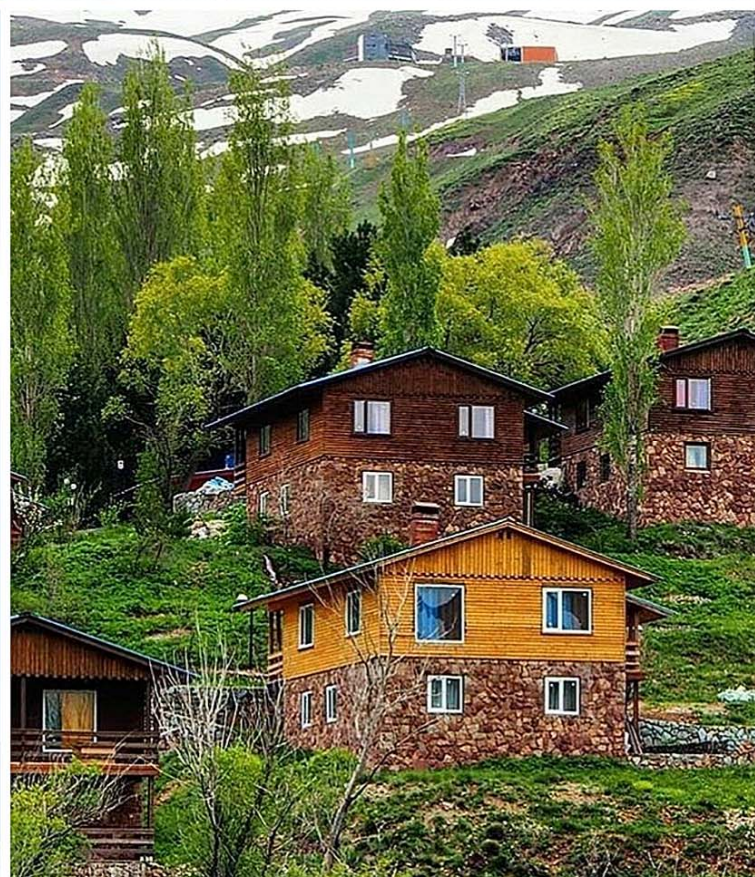
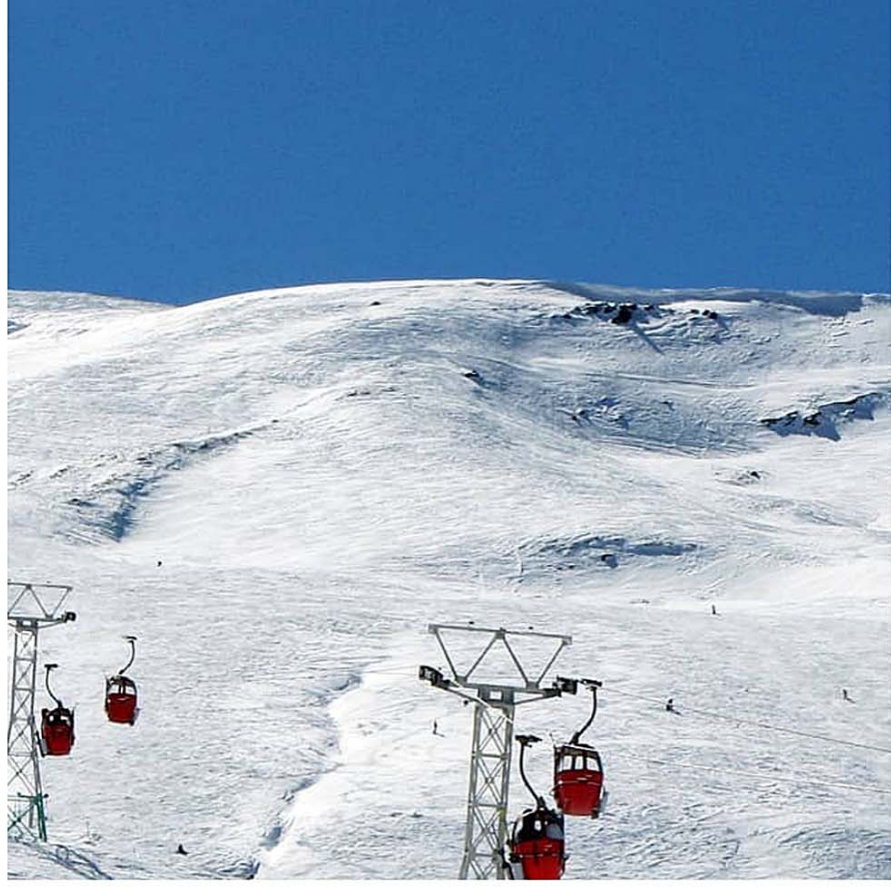
DIZIN SKI RESORT

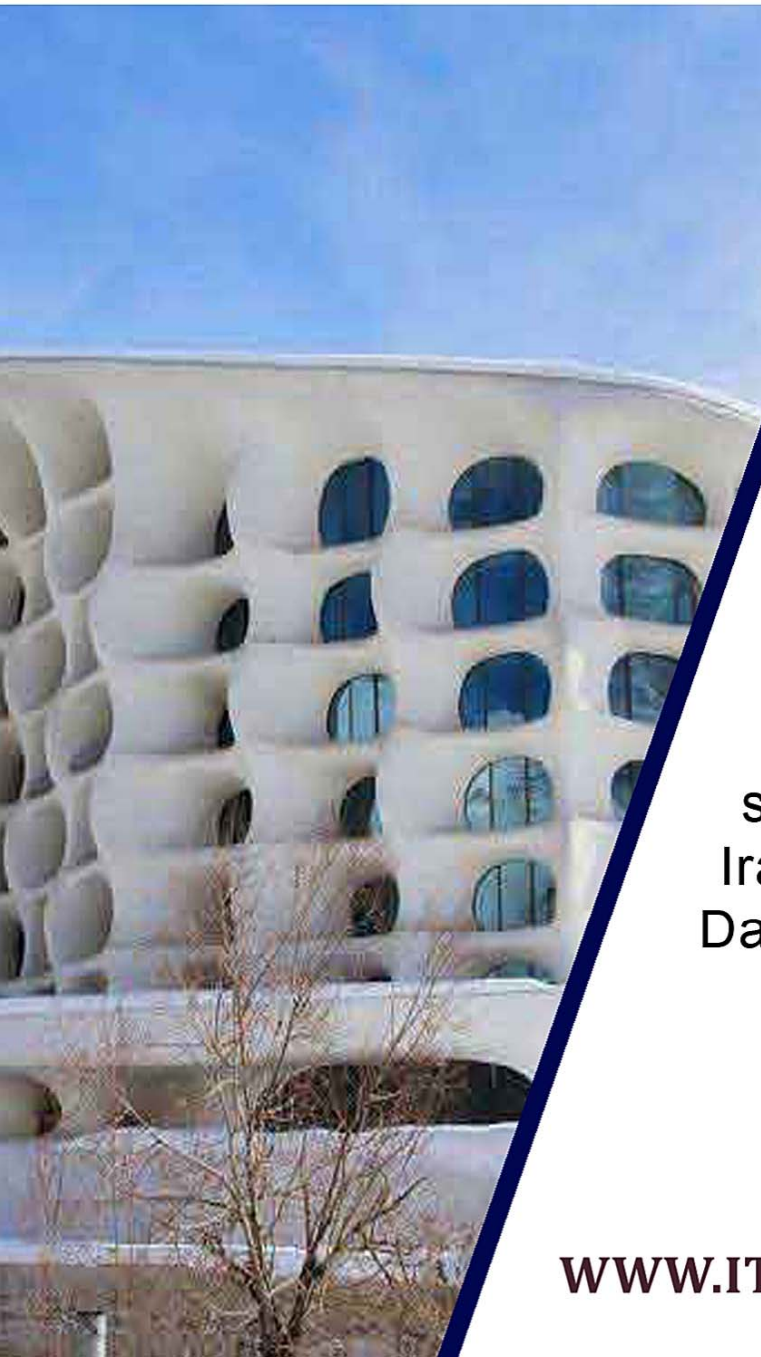

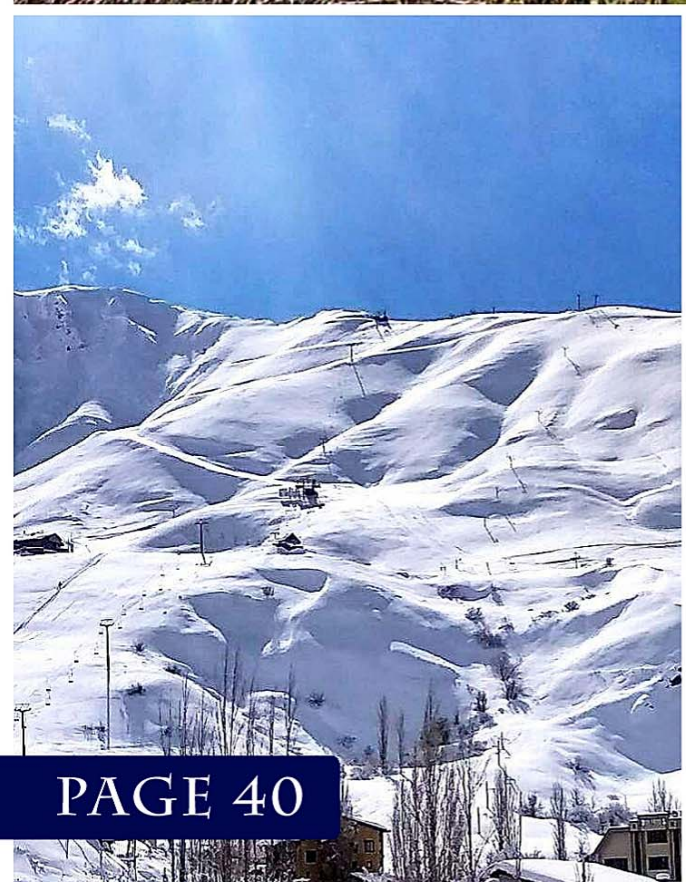
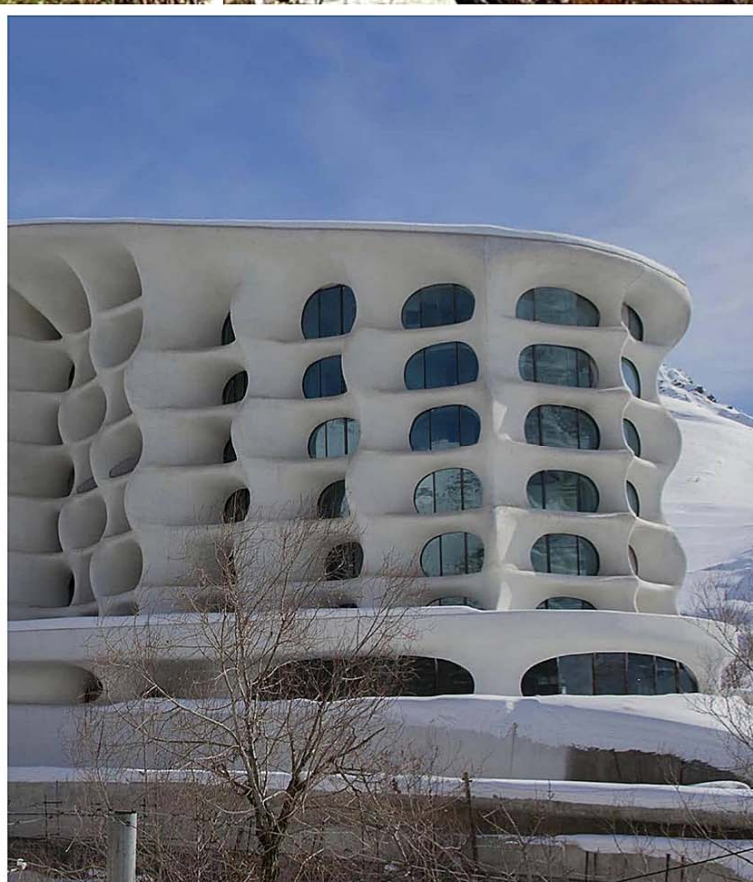
Shemshak is one the most famous and the third largest ski resorts in Iran.

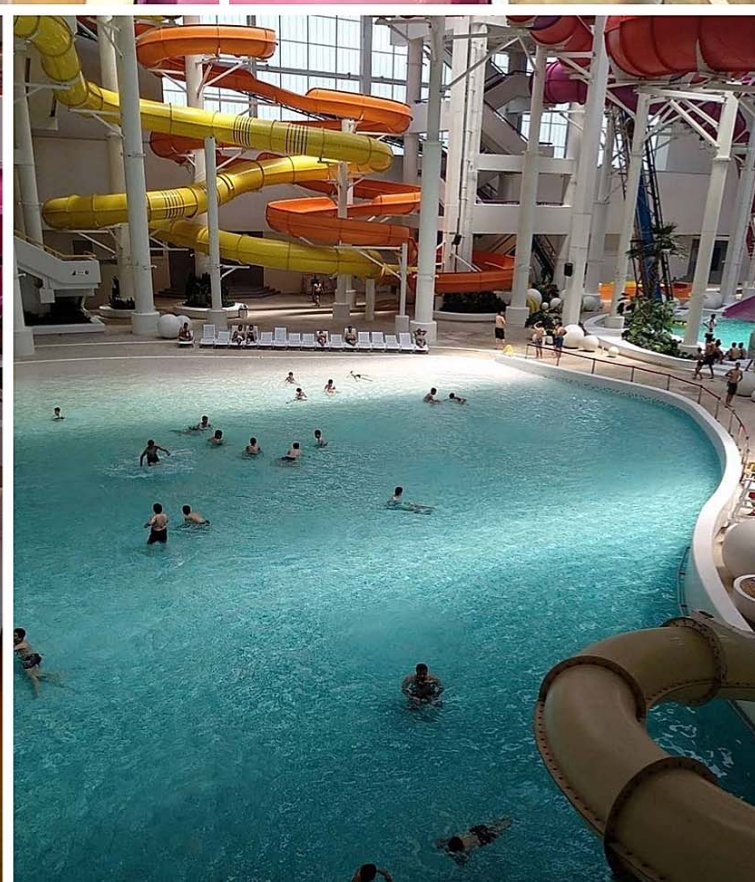
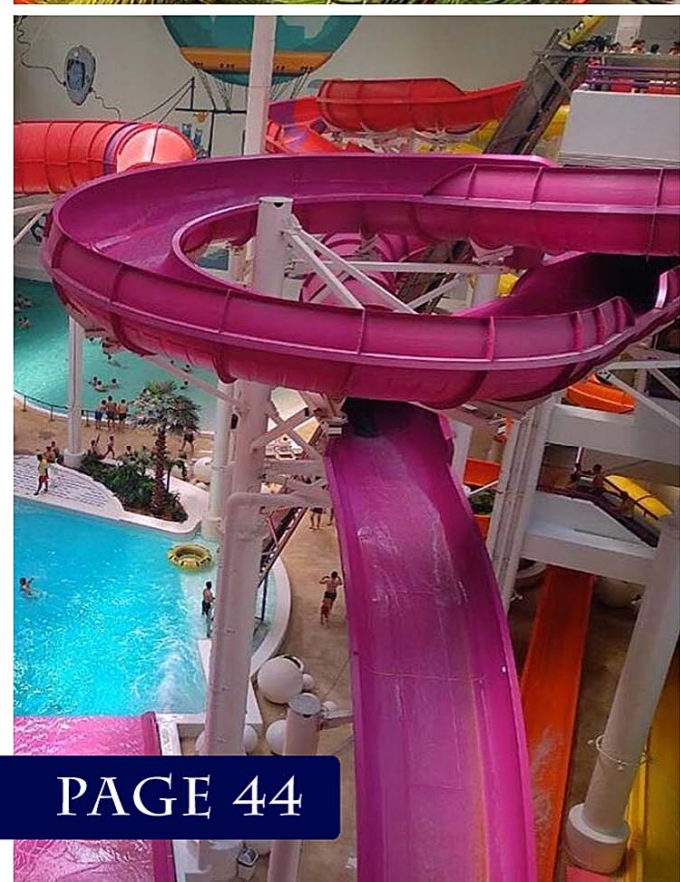
OPARK

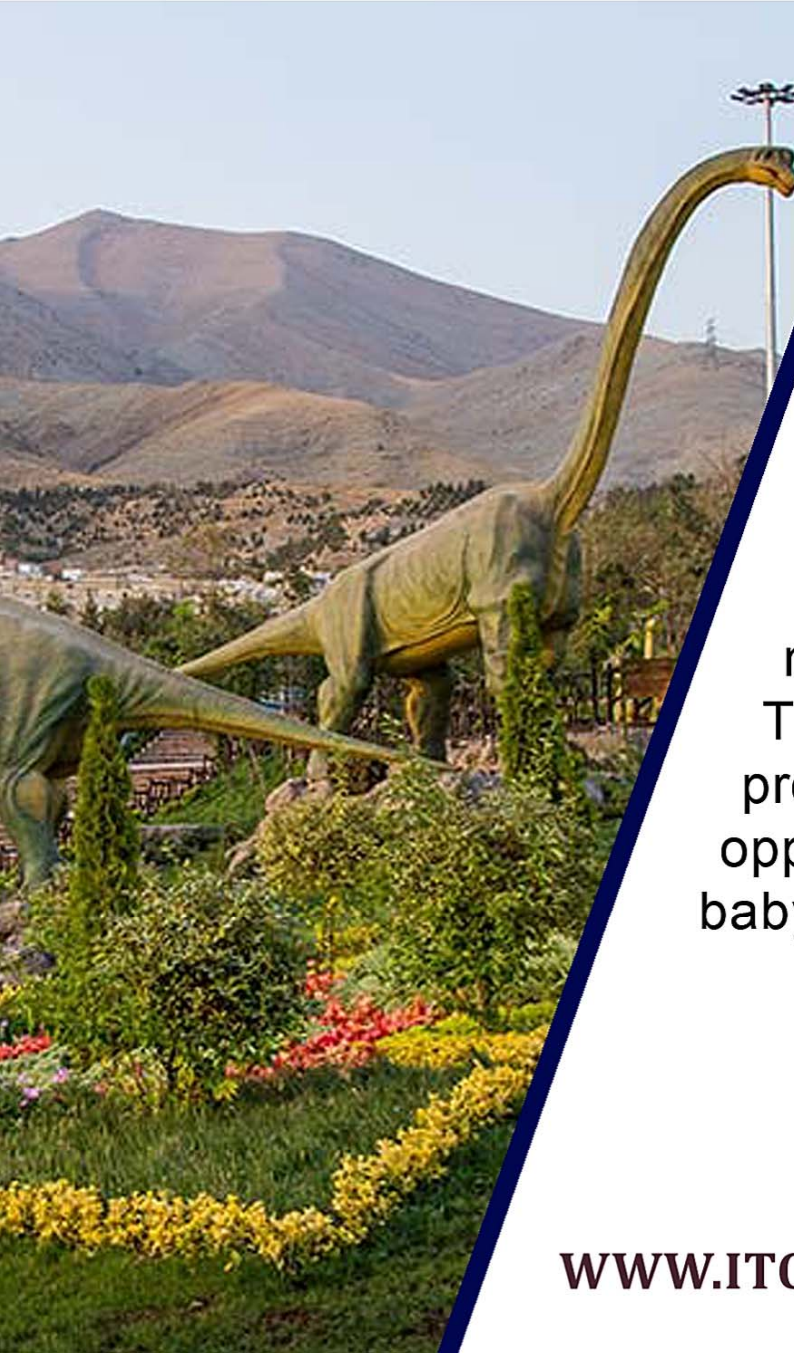

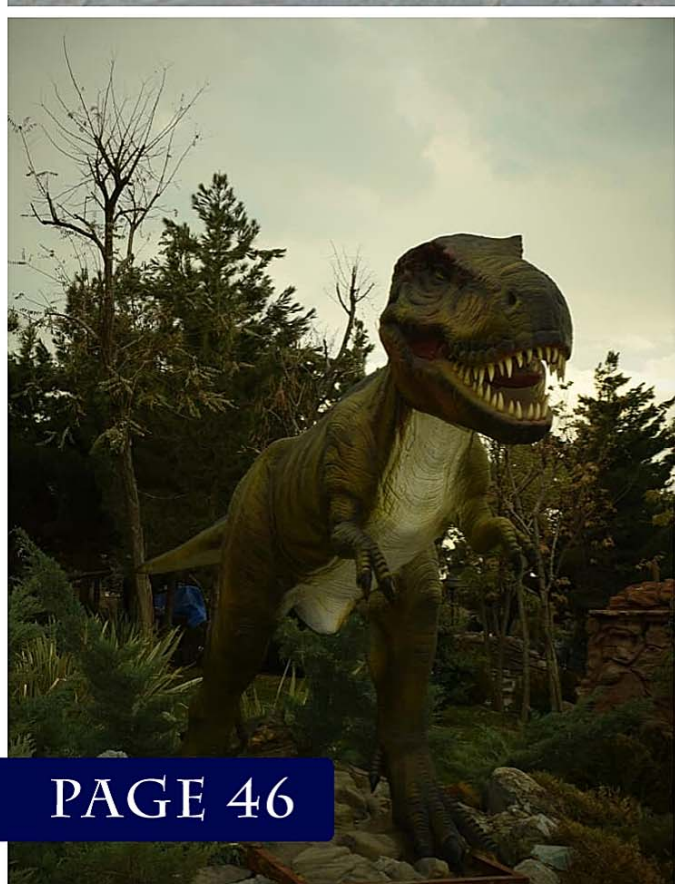
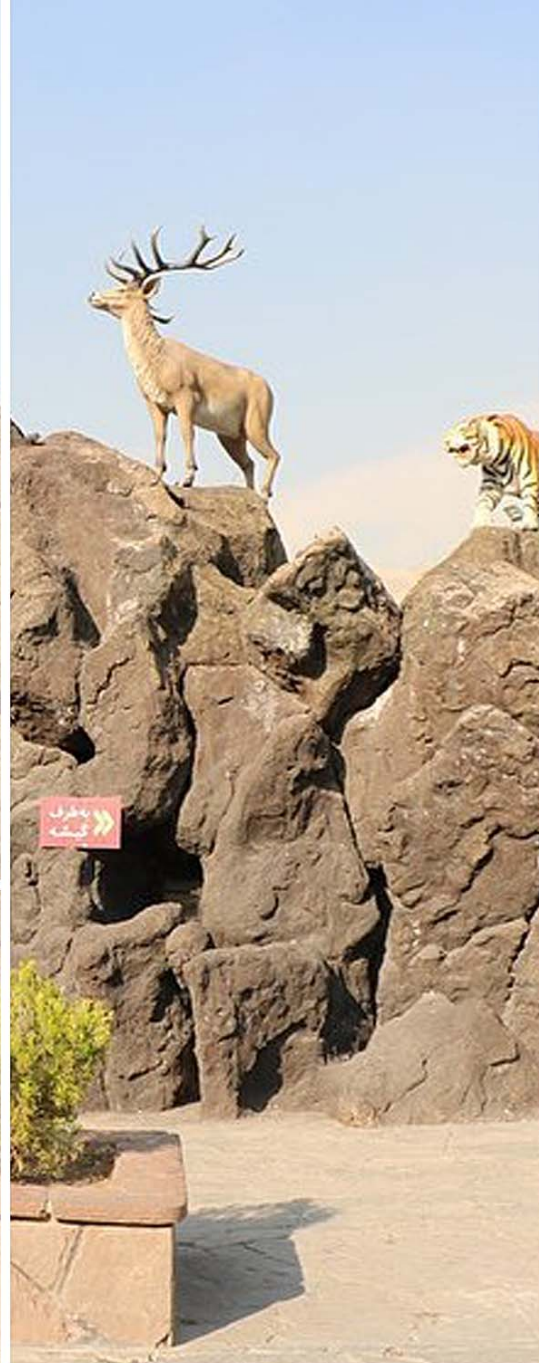
TEHRAN JURASSIC PARK

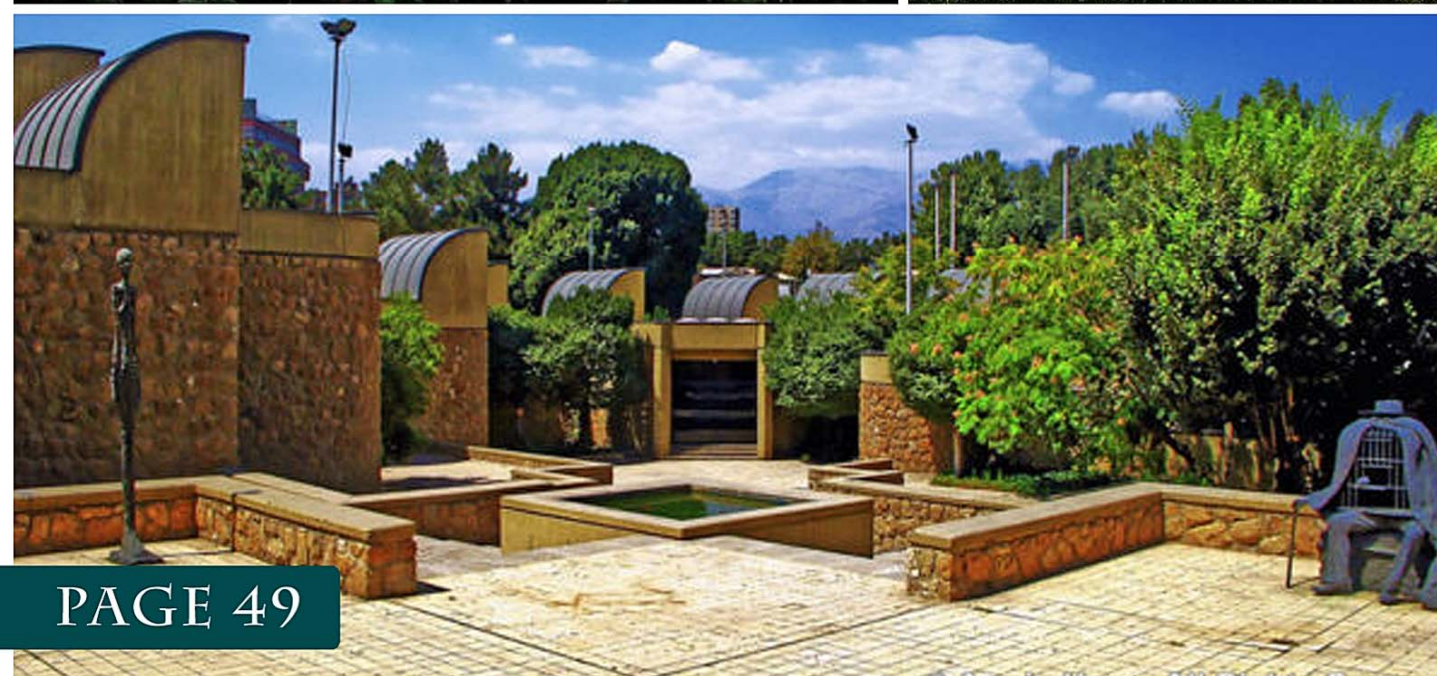
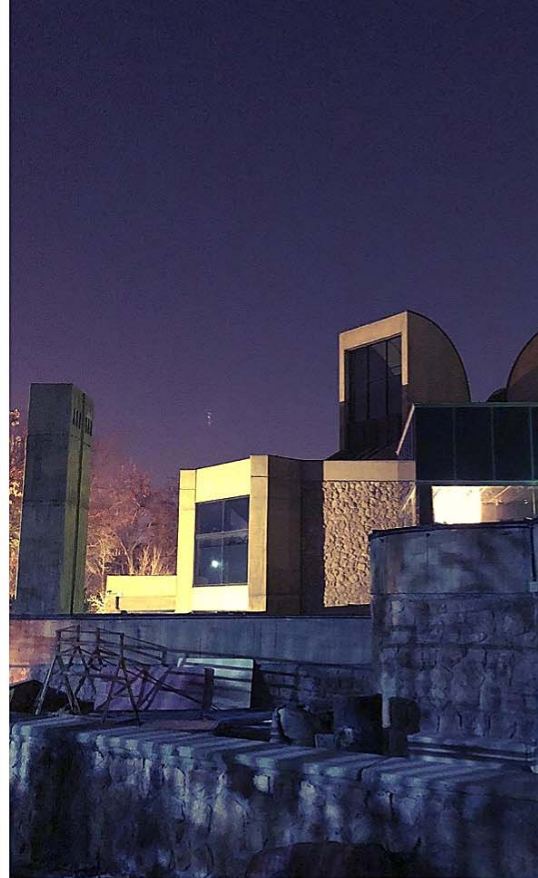
MUSEUM OF CONT. ART

Address: Laleh Park



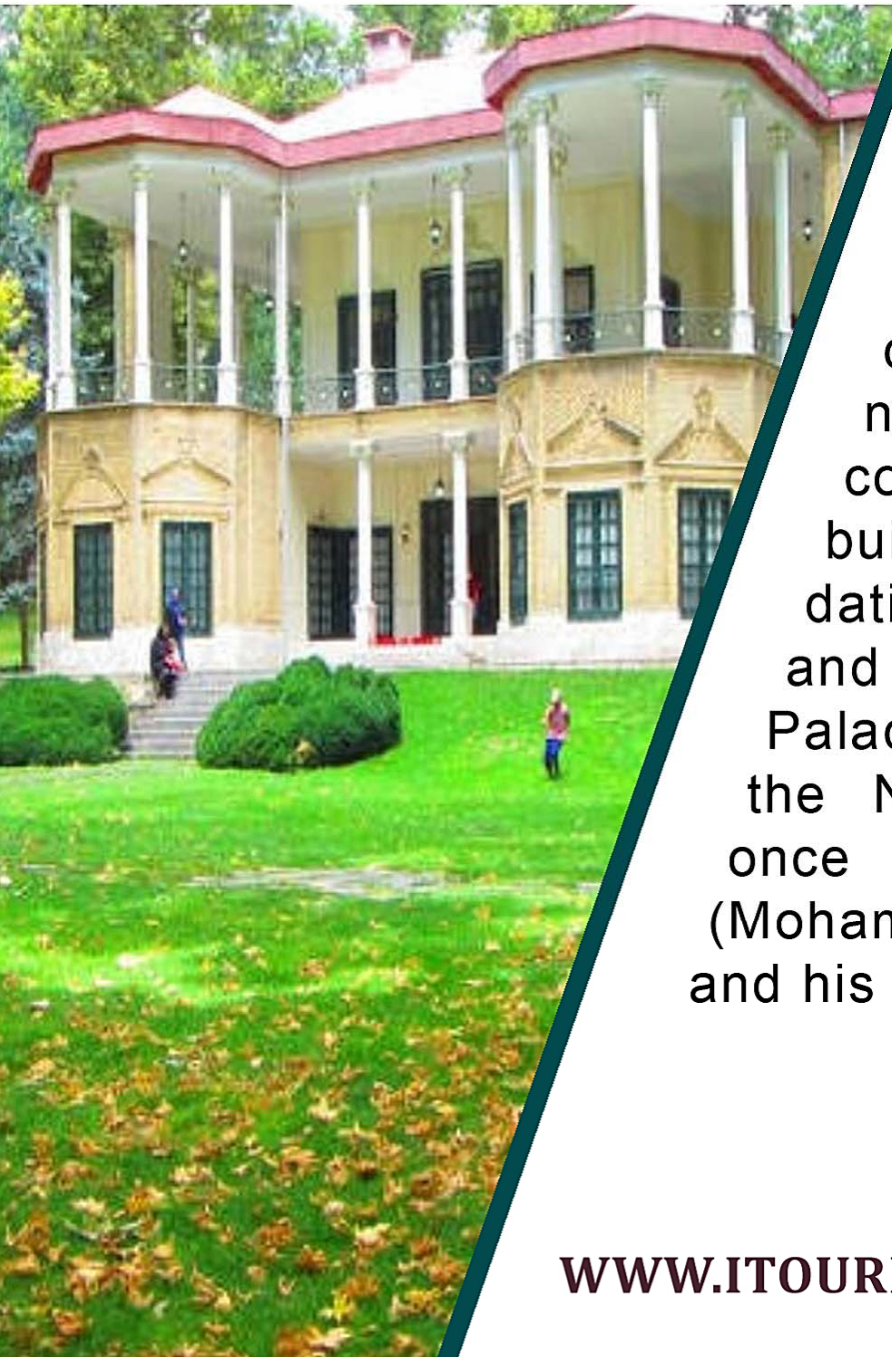

NIAVARAN PALACE CMLX

Niavaran Palace is a new building in the Niavaran complex that once the last king of Iran (Mohammad Reza Pahlavi) and his family lived there.

The Niavaran Palace Complex is a historical complex located in the north of Tehran, Iran. It consists of several palace buildings and monuments dating back to the Qajar and Pahlavi eras. Niavaran Palace is a new building in the Niavaran complex that once the last king of Iran (Mohammad Reza Pahlavi) and his family lived there.

NATIONAL JEWELRY MUS.

National Jewels of Iran dates back to Safavid era that national jewels belong to National Treasury of government, apart from the personal properties of the sovereign.

Address: Ferdowsi Street



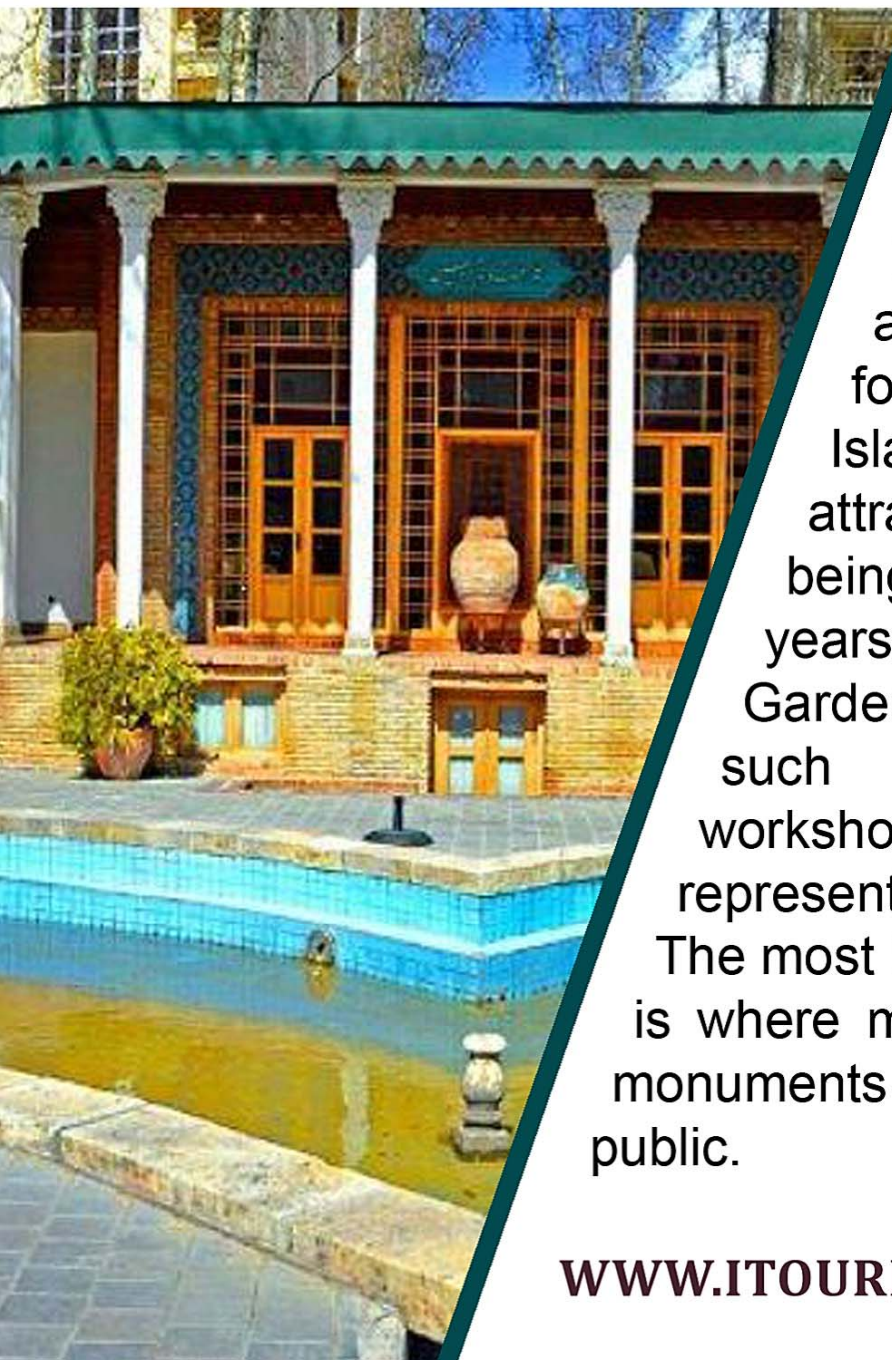
The background of National Jewels of Iran dates back to Safavid era in which it was decided that national jewels belong to National Treasury of government, apart from the personal properties of the sovereign. The valuable collections of this museum comprises of the pink colored diamond of Darya-ye-Noor (182 Carats), the Peacock Throne or Takhte Tavous which was built during the reign of Fathali Shah consisted of twelve different pieces (Joined together) and with 26,733 pieces of jewels attached to it.



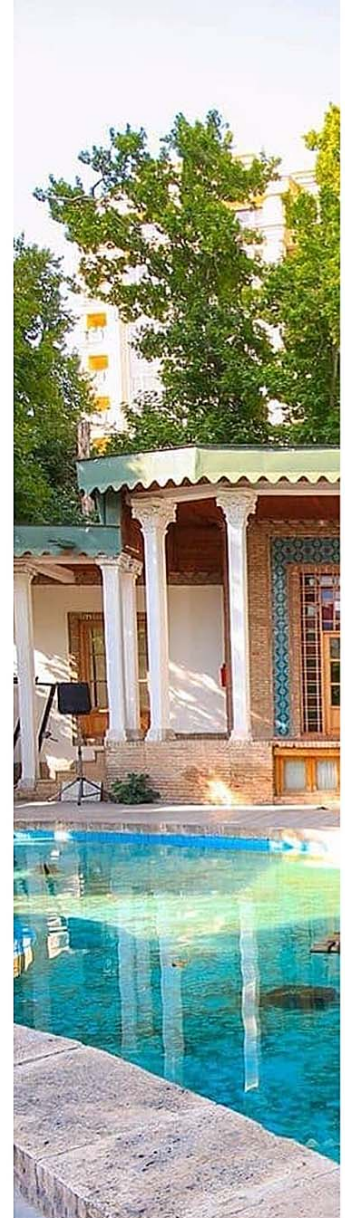
IRANIAN ART MUS. GARDEN

Iranian Art Museum Garden is a place where small models of Iran monuments are shown.

Iranian Art Museum Garden is located in Elahieh District and has less than one hectare area. Museum building was for Ms. Touran Mohajer Islami and has turned into an attractive attraction after being renovated during recent years. The Iranian Art Museum Garden owns many features such as art galleries and workshops, green area representing the Persian Gardens. The most important part of this place is where many small models of the monuments of Iran are shown to the public.



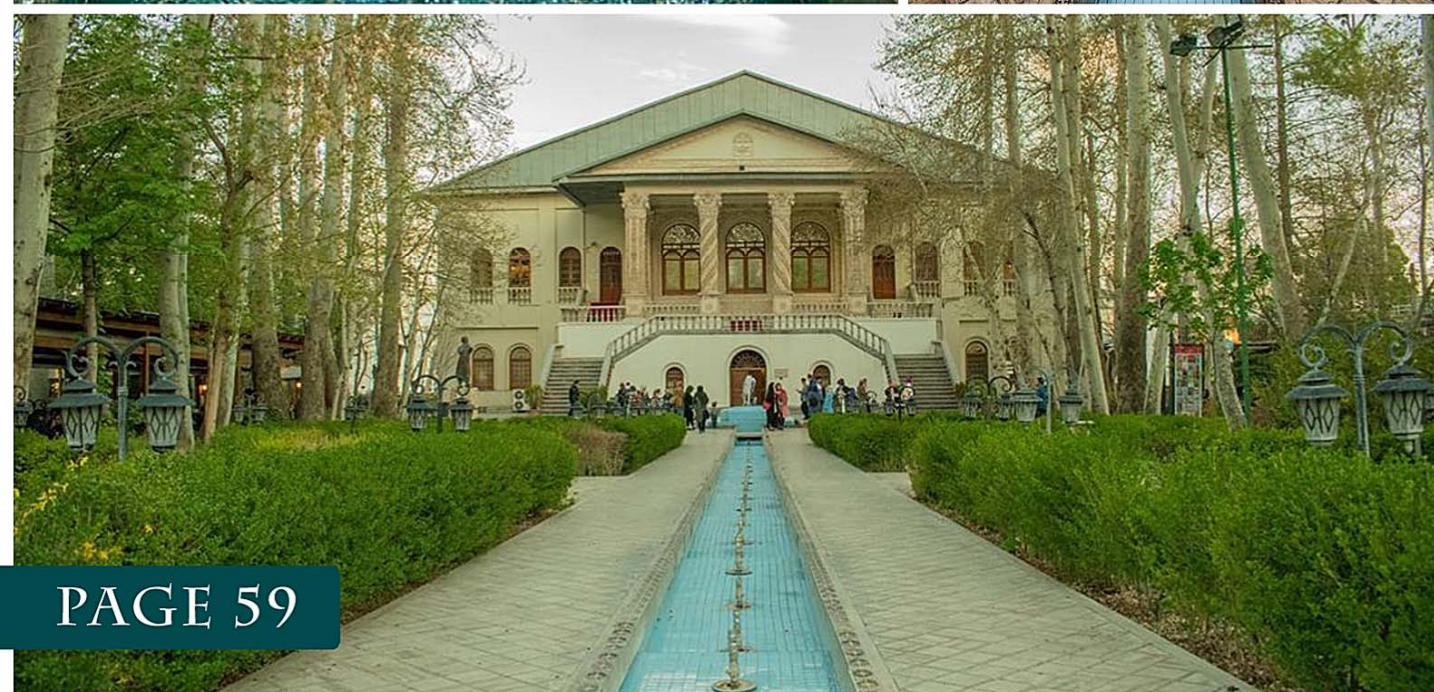
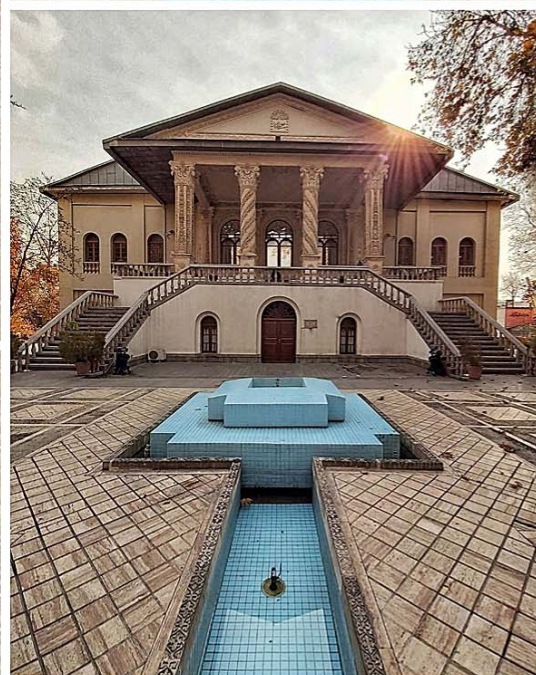
CINEMA MUSEUM

Cinema Museum of Iran is housed in a historical mansion in Bagh Ferdows.

This interesting museum has well-displayed and explained exhibits of equipment, photos and posters from Iran's century old movie industry. New and classic Iranian films are screened here daily.



CARPET MUSEUM

Carpet Museum of Iran was built during Pahlavi period and it's a magnificent museum for both architecture and carpet treasure.

The Carpet Museum of Iran was designed by Queen Farah Diba and mixes classic 70s' style with carpet-inspired function. The exterior is meant to resemble threads on a loom. This museum is a repository for hundreds of exquisite Iranian carpets from Tabriz, Kashan, Isfahan and Kerman.



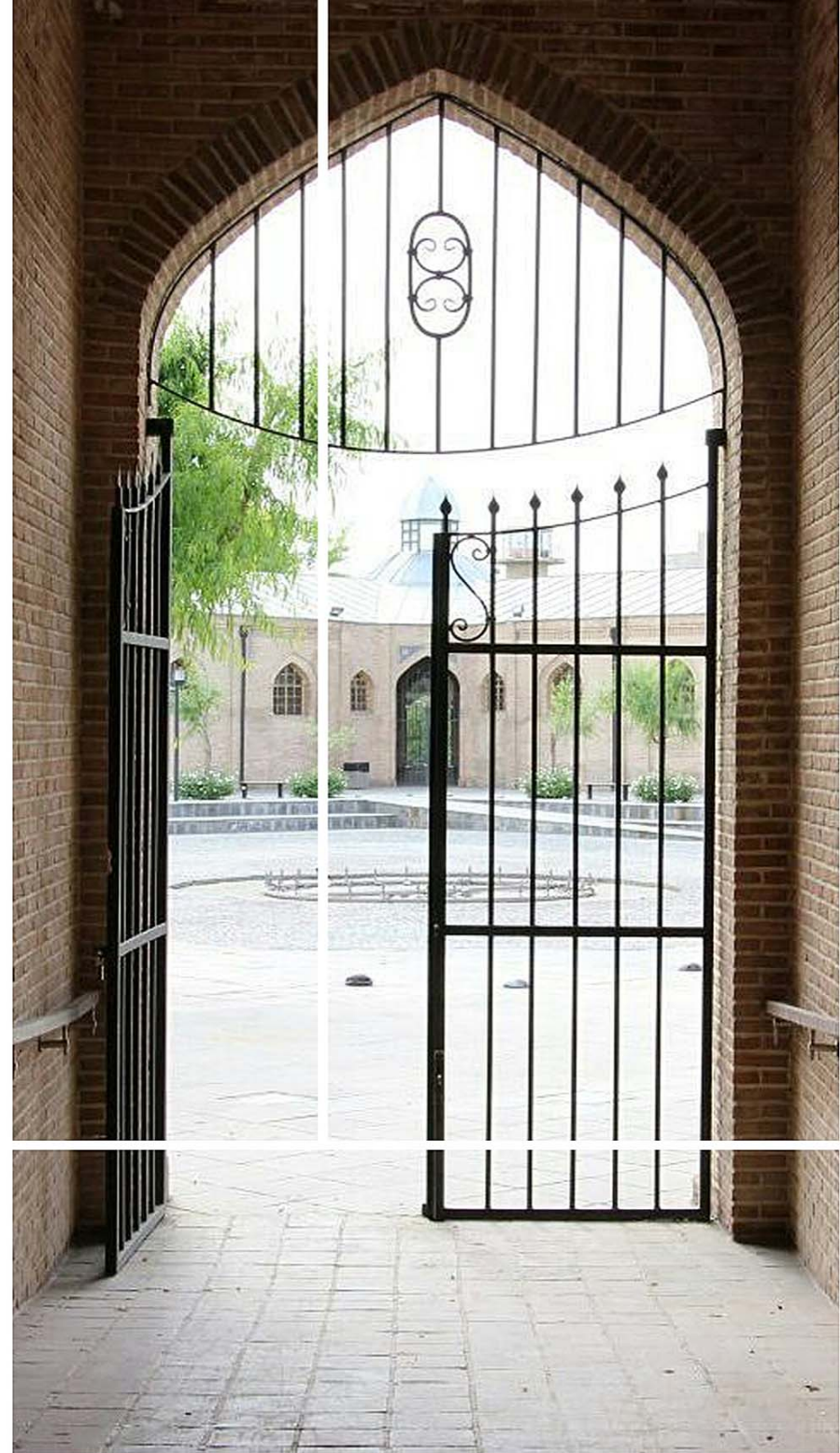
QASR PRISON MUSEUM

Qasr Prison was the first one of its kind in Tehran which has been turned into a museum.

Address: Police Street



Qasr Prison was built during Pahlavid period in Tehran by a Russian architect. It consists of 192 rooms and has a capacity of 700 prisoners. The architecture of this prison is in a way to suffer prisoners as it is too hot in summers and too cold in winters. Qasr Garden-Museum was first a castle created by the order of Fathali Shah of Qajar, and after 130 years, the first prison of Tehran was formed on the foundation of Qajar palace.



TIME MUSEUM

The Museum of Time in Tehran represents the timekeeping devices during periods of time.

Address: Zaferaniyeh Street



Time Museum is a blue plastered building in a garden with interesting architecture and decorations. Old Iranian and foreign clocks from France, Switzerland, England and Germany are exhibited in this museum. The timekeeping devices in this museum are displayed in several sections, which include basic clocks, mechanical weight-driven clocks and alarm clocks, pocket watches and wristwatches, and calendar devices.



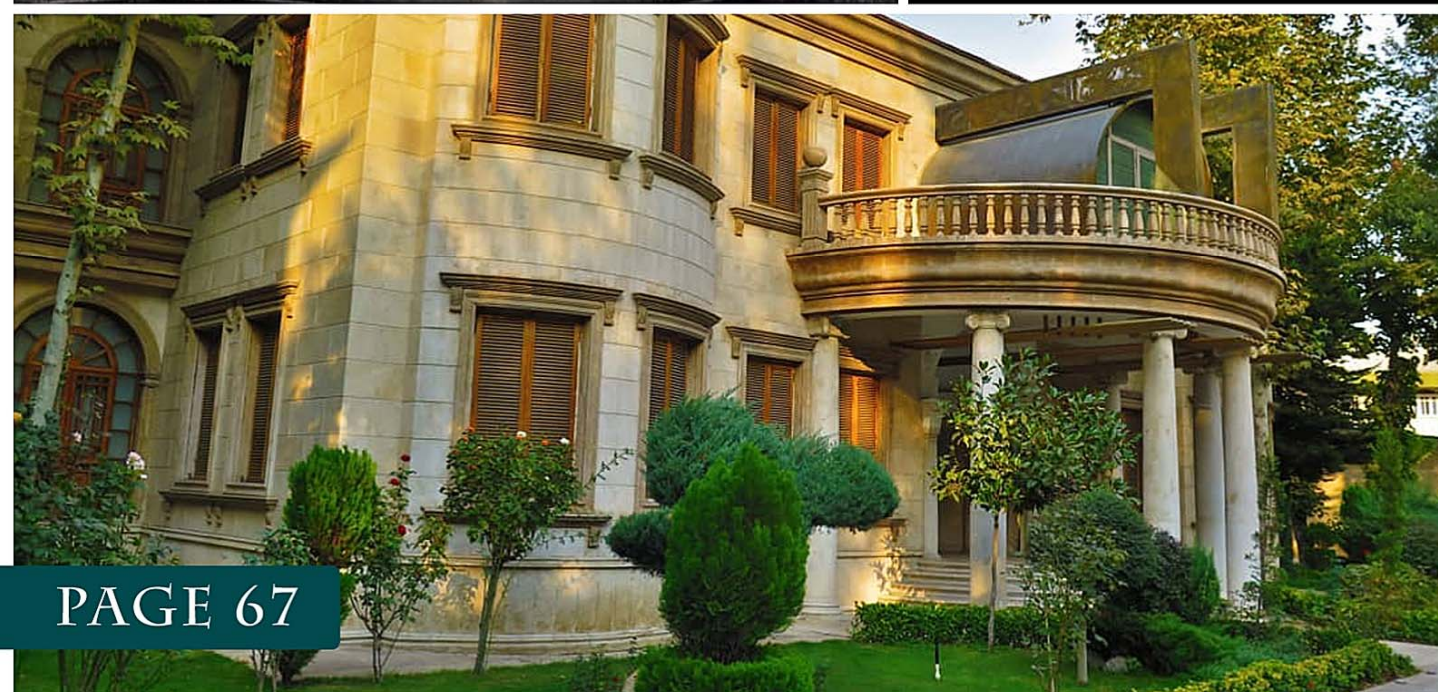
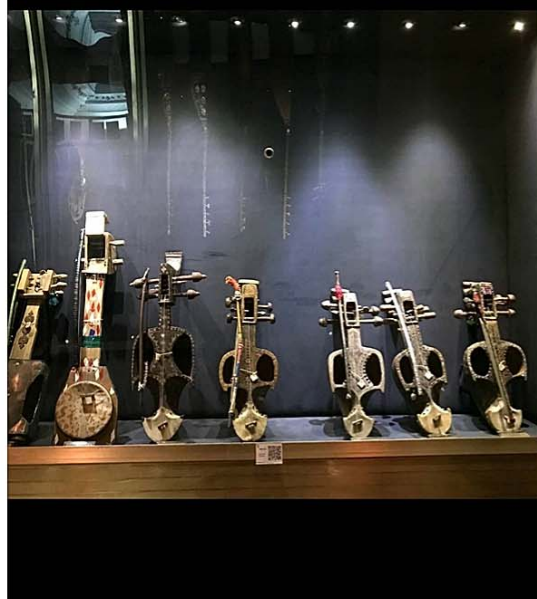
MUSIC MUSEUM

Address: Namazi Street



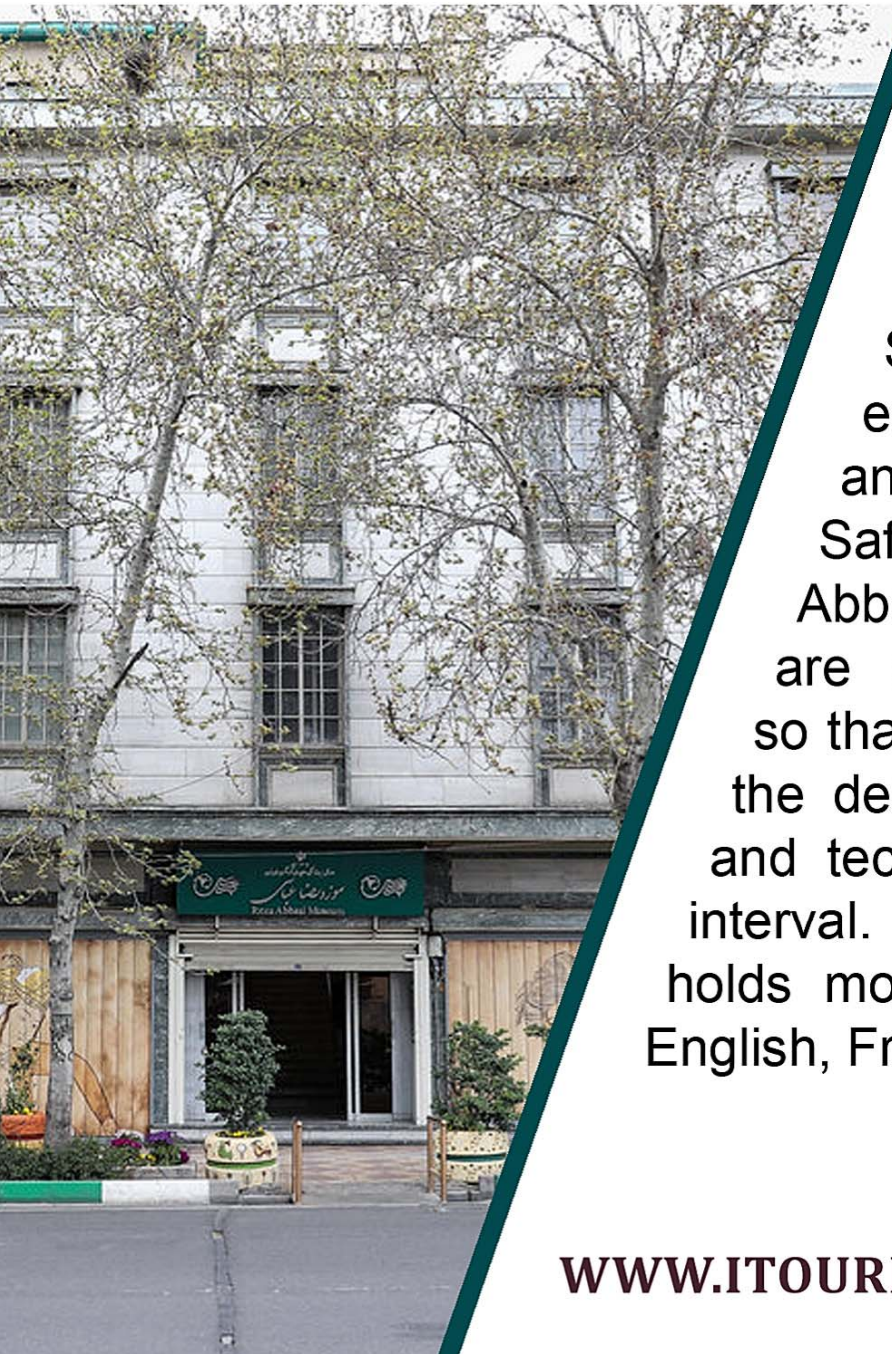
Music museum covers an area of 3,650 square meters, and the three-story building has 1,400 square-meters area. There are more than 20,000 records of Iranian music history, and approximately 410 musical instruments, all Persian folk music traditions belonging to various cultures that played in the past and present.



REZA ABBASI MUSEUM

Reza Abbasi is one of the best and most professionally art museums in the country.

Address: Shariati Street



Reza Abbasi Museum is named after one of the great artists of the Safavid period which exhibits Iranian art from ancient times and the Safavid era paintings of Abbasi himself. The displays are arranged chronologically so that the visitors can observe the development of art, culture and technology during this time interval. The museum's library holds more than 10,000 Persian, English, French and German books.

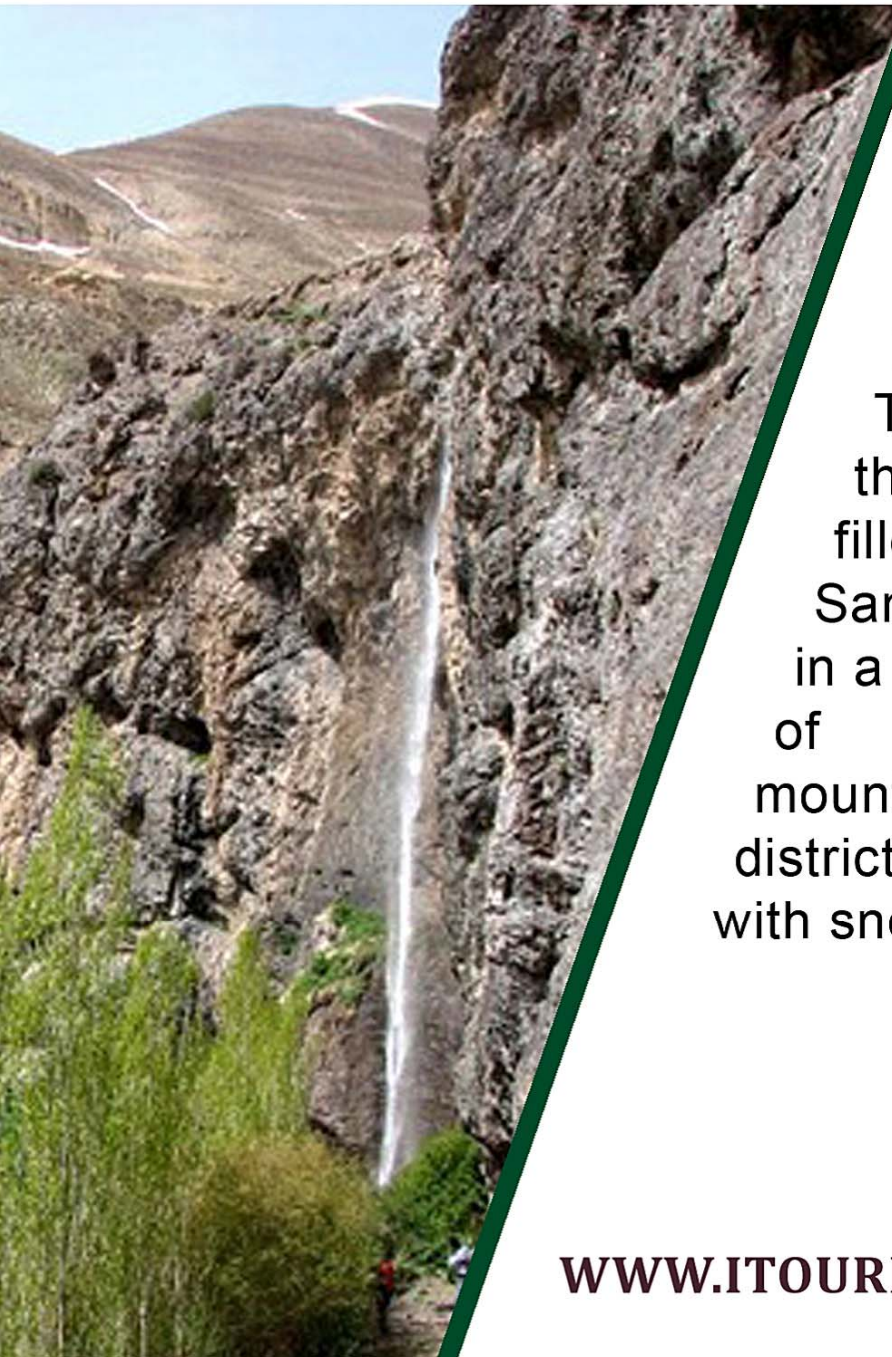

SANGAN WATERFALL

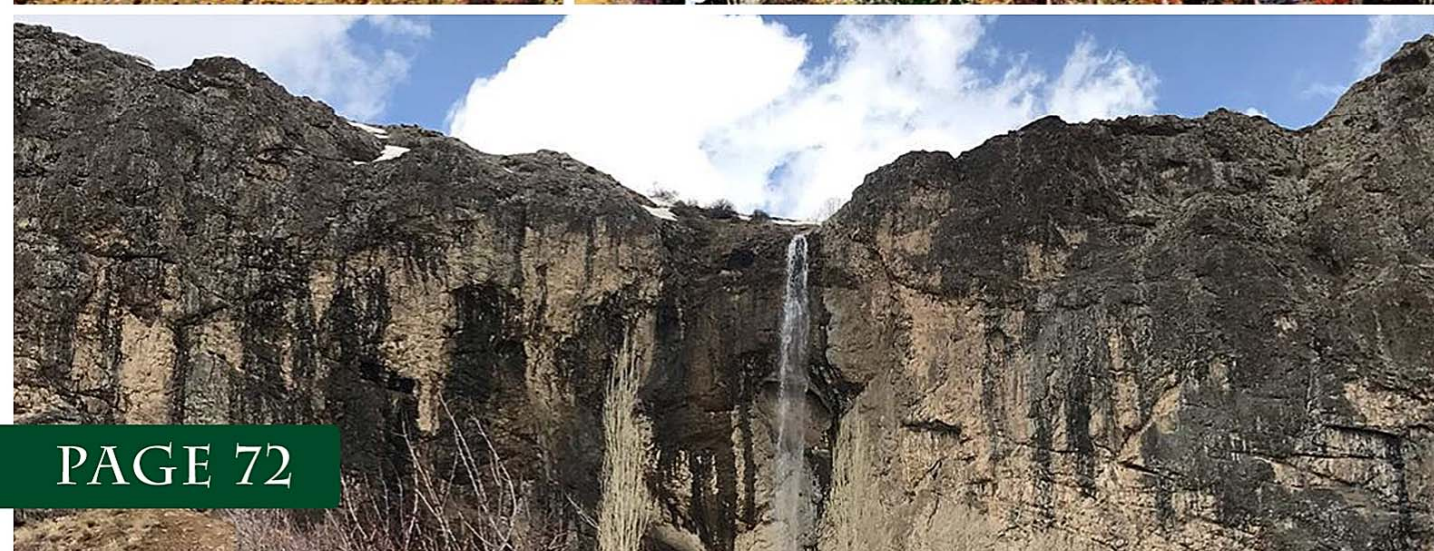
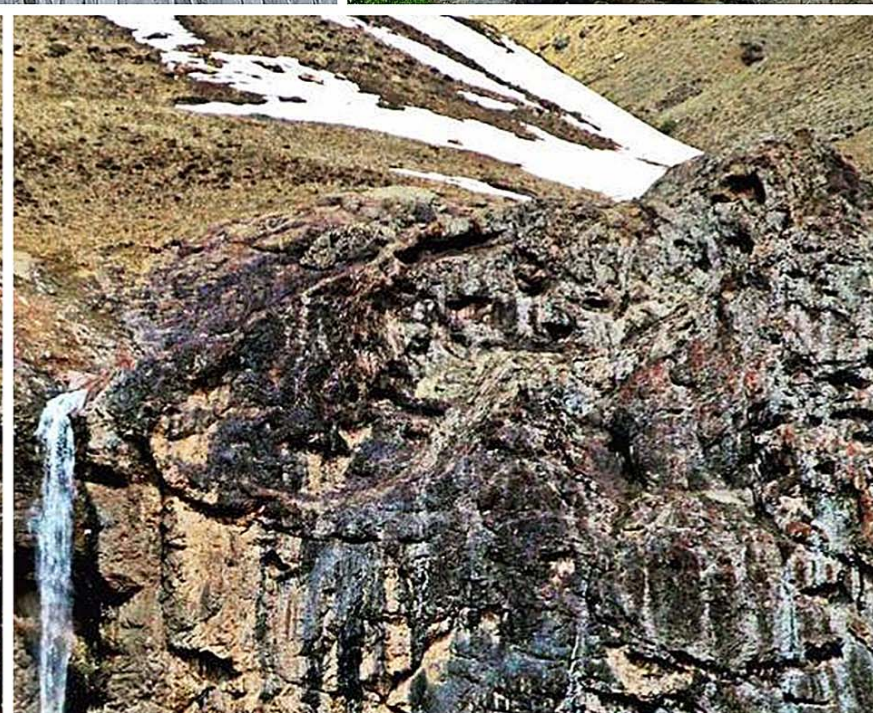
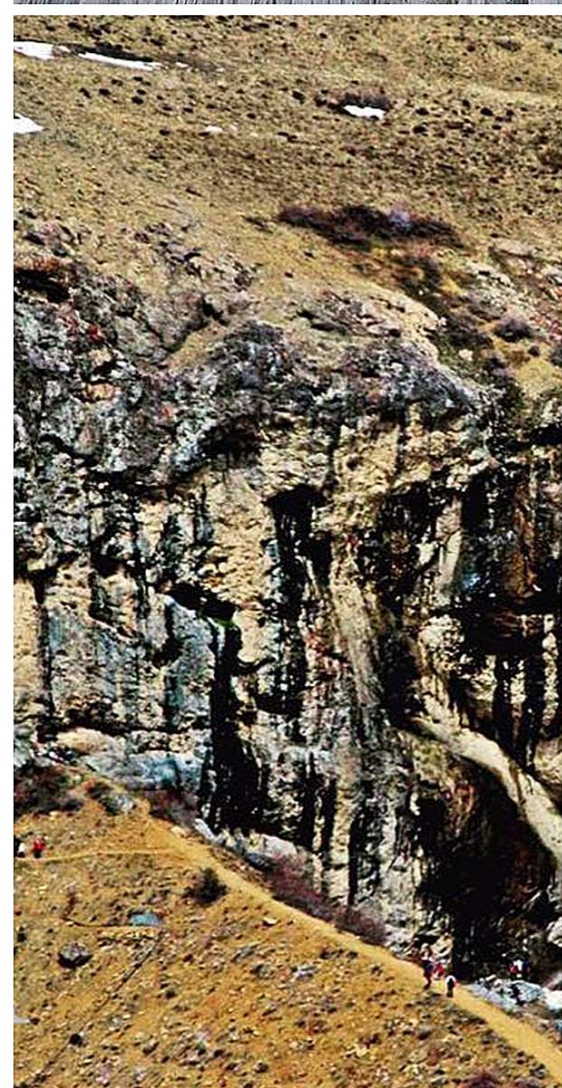
Sangan Waterfall with almost 42 Meters height is located 20 kilometers to the northwest of Tehran.

Address: 20km northwest of Tehran



Sangan is a mountainous village on Kan Road, northwest of Tehran. Sangan is one of the valleys of the region filled with water. The whole Sangan district is situated in a long valley and consists of four sectors. The mountains around this rural districts are always covered with snow during winter.

Dogholou Waterfall is a seasonal one near Tehran and in the main route to Tochal.

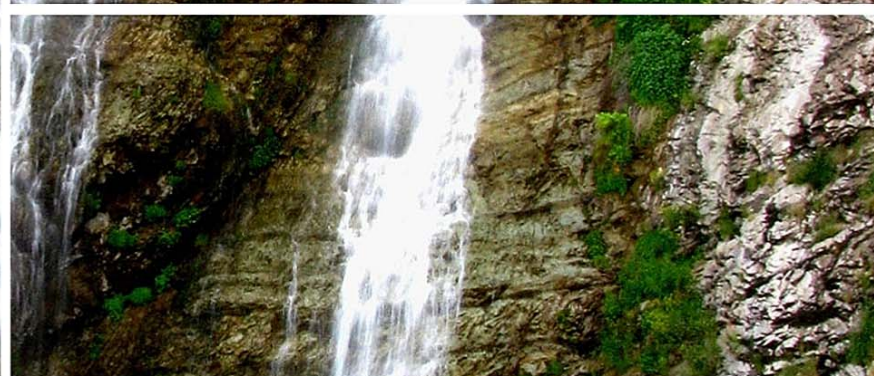
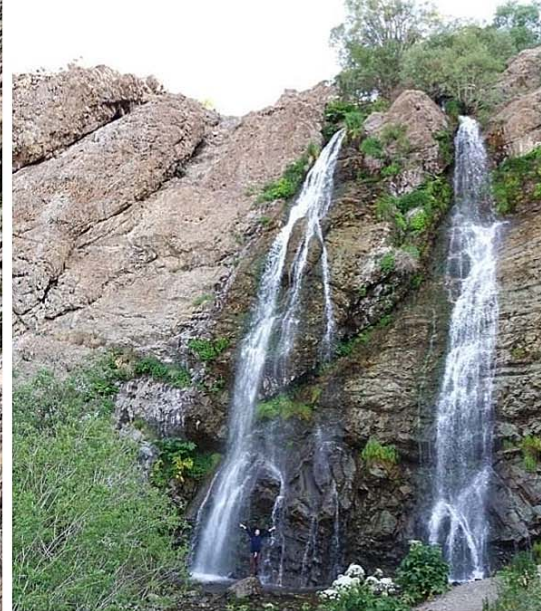
Address: North of Tehran

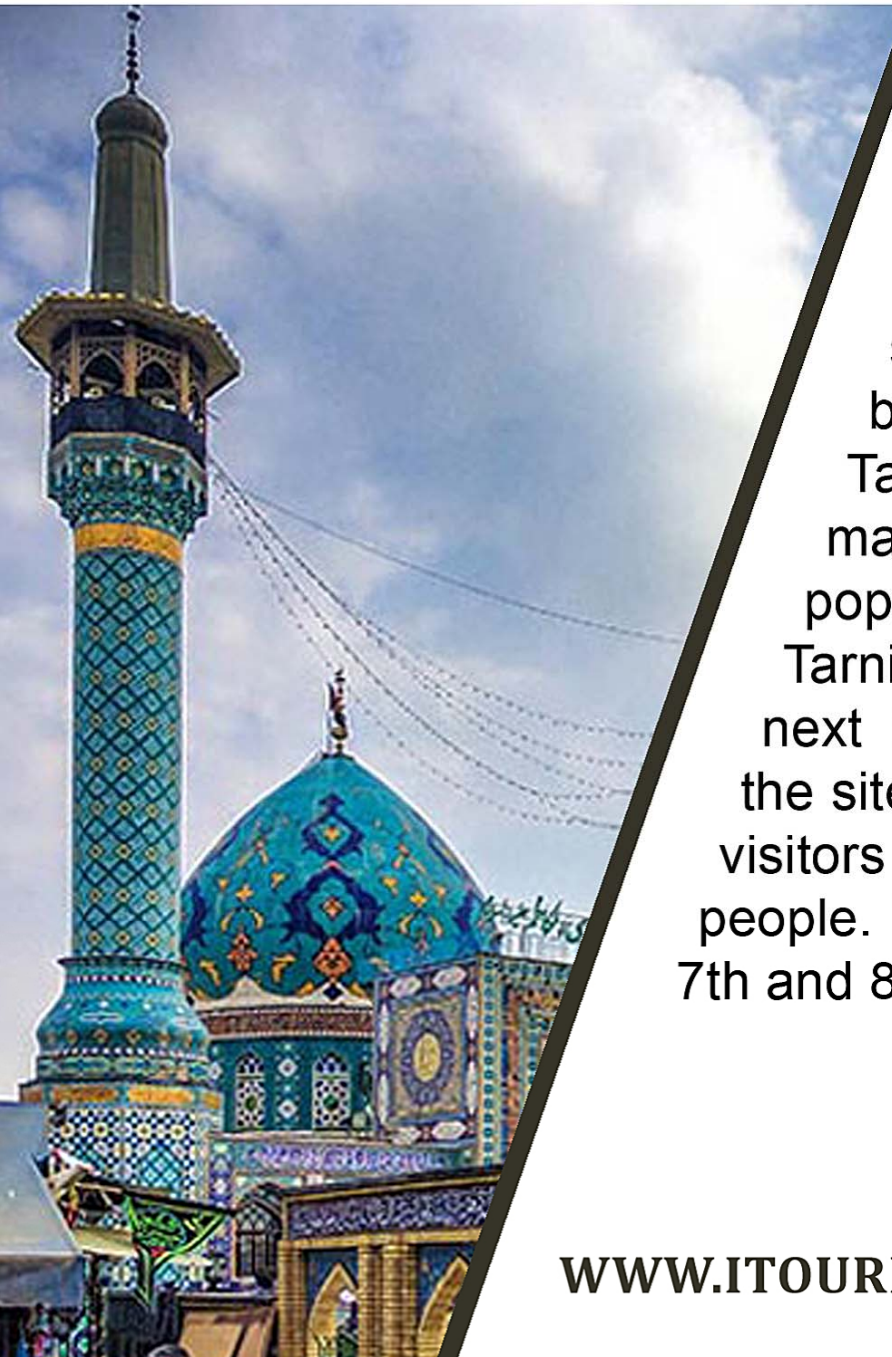

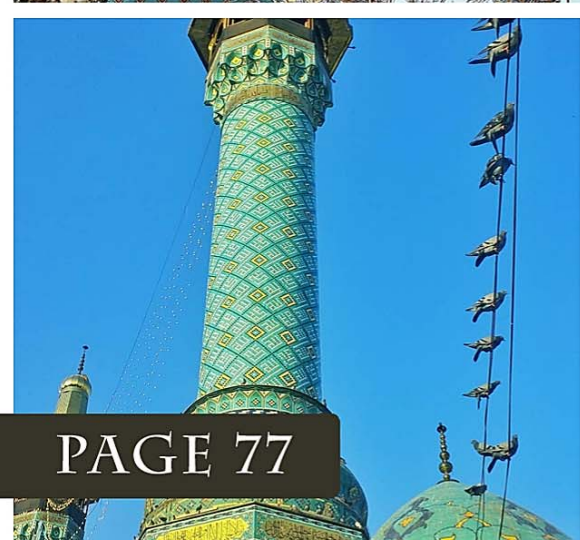
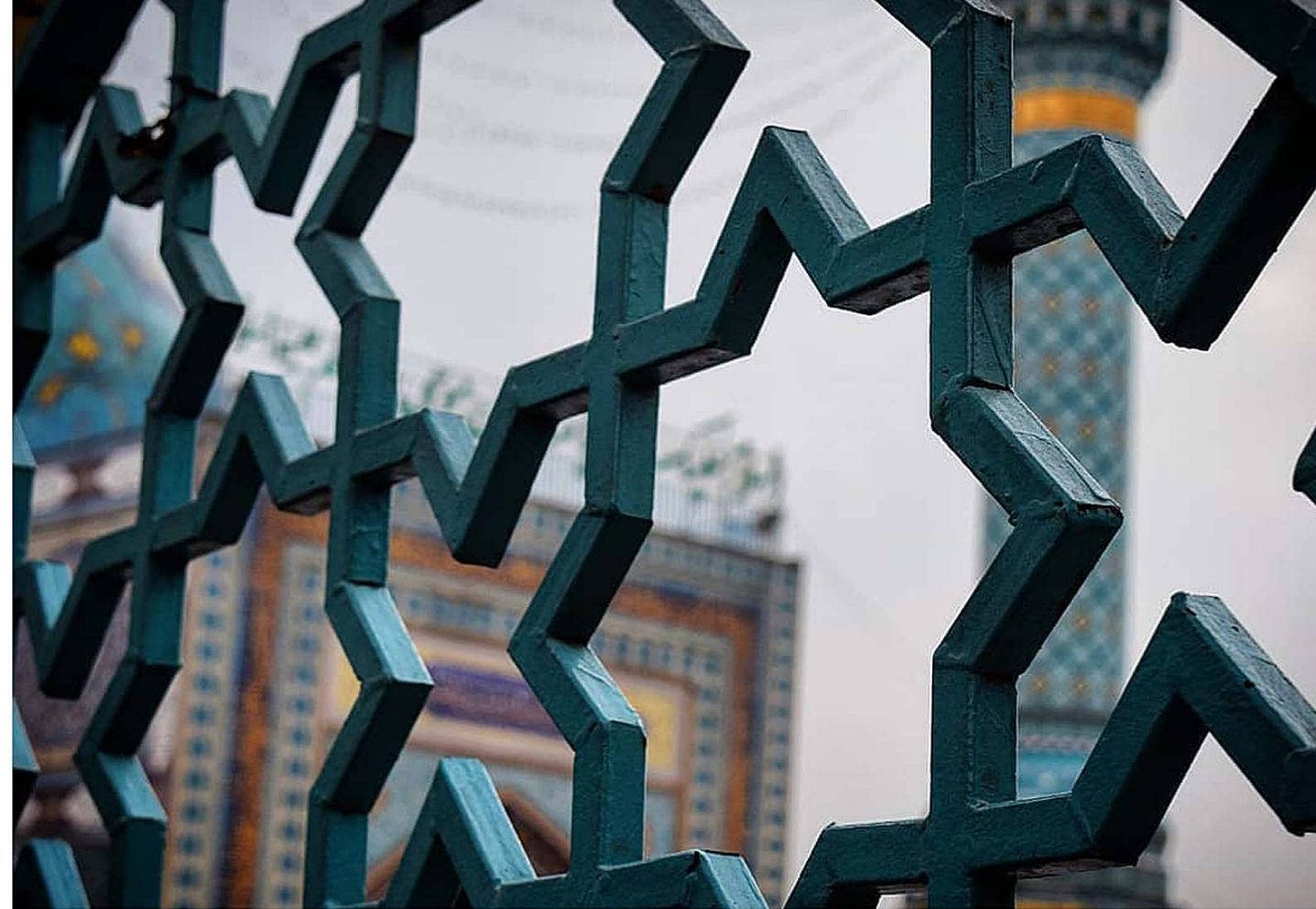
Emamzadeh Saleh is a mausoleum in Tajrish square which has numerous visitors from all Shiite countries.

Address: Tajrish Square



This mausoleum belongs to the son of the sixth Shiite Imam. The building was located in Tajrish square which is a major square with high population density, the Tarnish bazaar is also located next to the mausoleum, thus the sites has an estimated daily visitors count of around 30000 people. The building was built in 7th and 8th Hijri century.

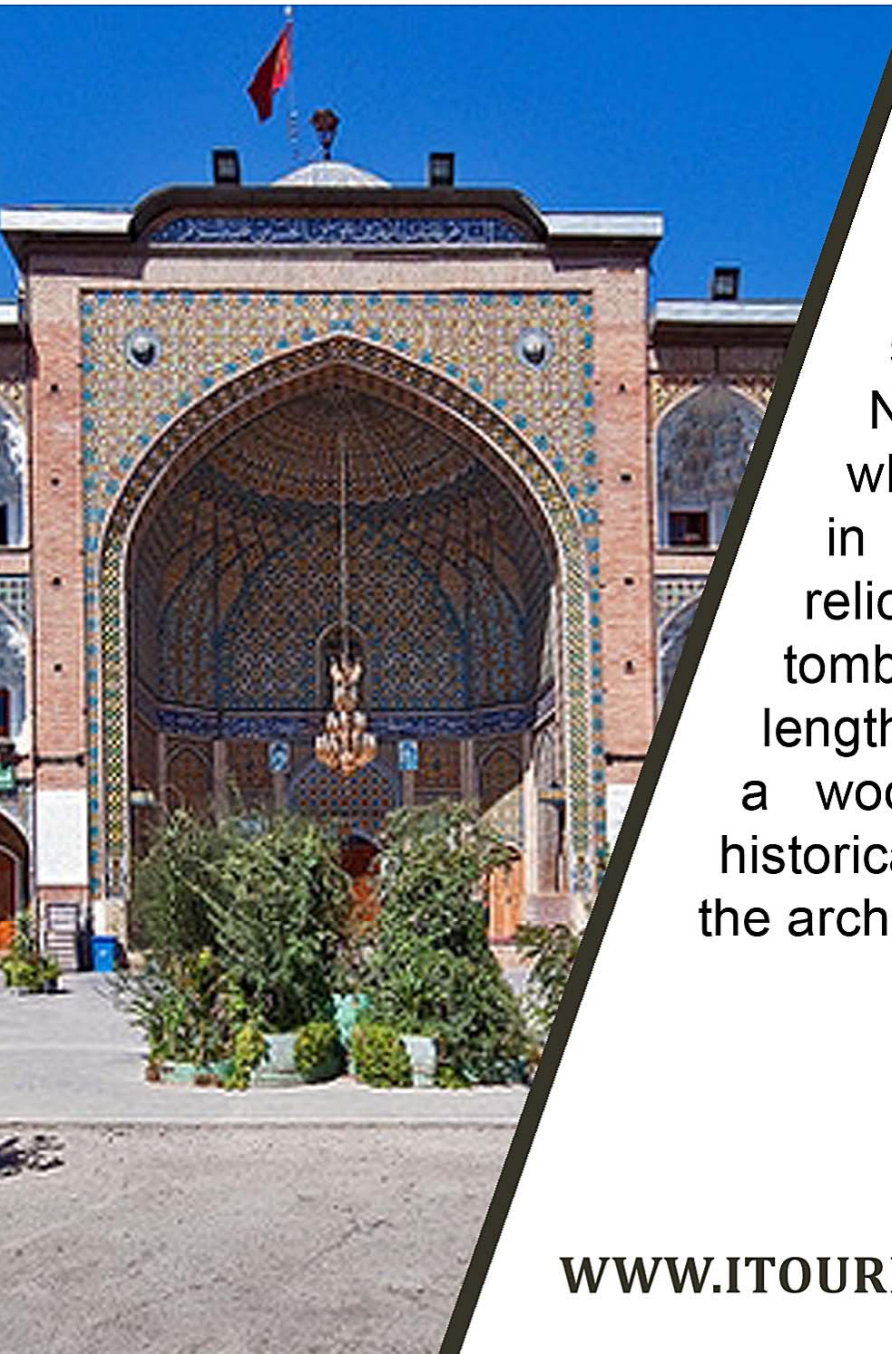




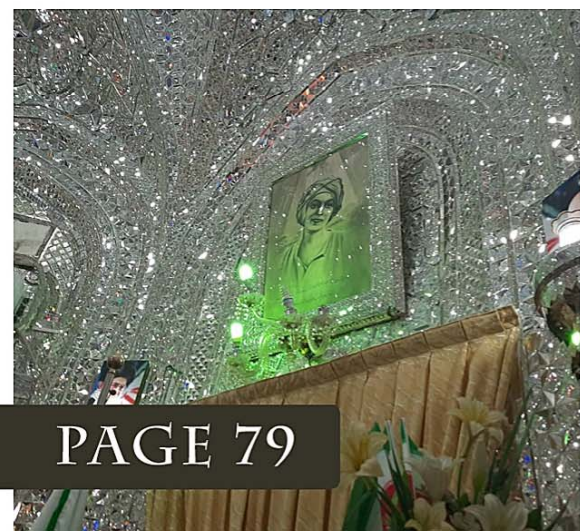
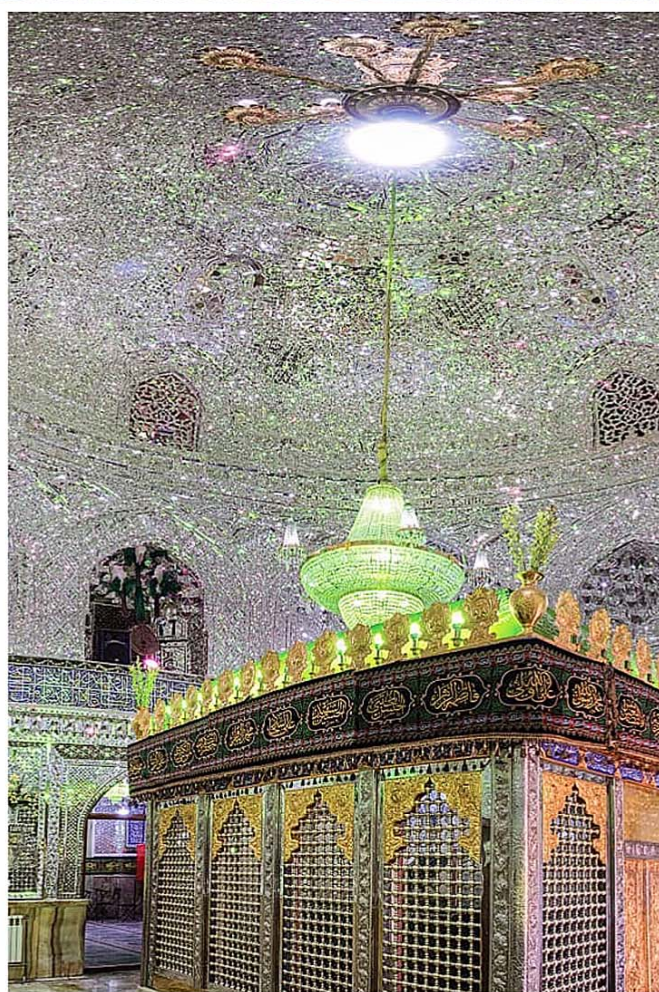
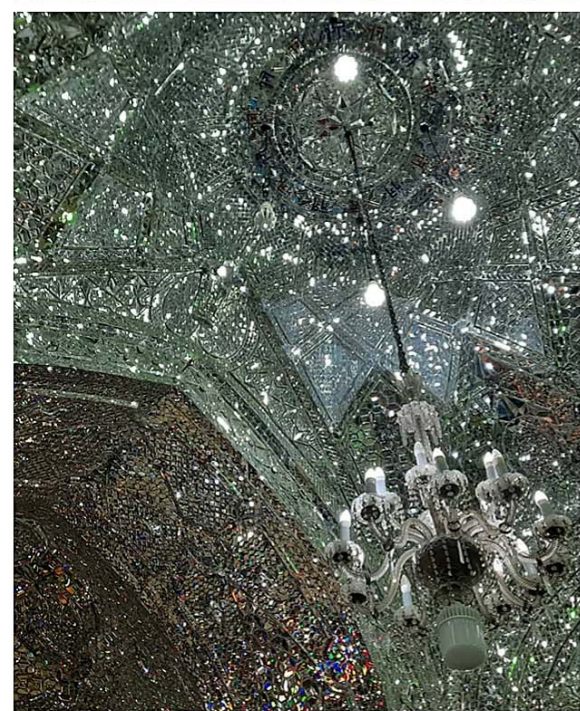
EMAMZADEH ZEID

Emamzadeh Zeid is a post Islamic religious site in Bazaar Neighborhood in Tehran which has been registered in the list of Iran national relics near Lotf Ali Khan tomb. The site has 6 meters length and 4 meters width with a wooden Zarih. There are historical inscriptions that shows the archaism of it.
